An act to add Article 16.5 (commencing with Section 41965) to Chapter 5 of Part 24 of the Education Code, relating to school finance.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 122, as amended, Leslie. School finance: snow removal.

Existing law makes a school district eligible to receive a supplemental apportionment for transportation if, among other things, the total cost per mile for the prior fiscal year for home-to-school transportation does not exceed the statewide average cost per mile, or if the total cost per mile for the prior fiscal year for home-to-school transportation exceeds the statewide average cost per mile, the school district demonstrates to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Public Instruction that the increased cost per mile is due to either weather-related or terrain-related conditions. Under existing law, the Superintendent of Public Instruction is required to determine that the increased cost per mile is due to weather-related or terrain-related conditions if snow and ice create roadway and safety problems, 50% or more of publicly maintained roads in the school district are considered to be curves, or there are changes in elevation of 2,000 feet or more on publicly maintained roads in the school district.

This bill would make a school district eligible to receive a supplemental apportionment from the State Department of Education, to the extent that funds are provided for in the annual Budget Act, in an

amount equal to 50% of the district’s direct costs for snow removal, as defined, that is in excess of \$10 ~~or more~~ per unit of average daily attendance on snow removal.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

6 41965. (a) A school district is eligible to receive a
7 supplemental apportionment from the State Department of
8 Education in an amount equal to 50 percent of the district’s direct
9 costs for snow removal that is in excess of ten dollars (\$10) ~~or more~~
10 per unit of average daily attendance for snow removal.

11 (b) For the purposes of this section, “snow removal” includes
12 removing snow on campus building tops, structural overhangs,
13 sidewalks, pathways, and parking lots for classroom access and
14 public safety purposes, and the maintenance of snow removal
15 equipment.

16 (c) A school district shall only receive a supplemental
17 apportionment pursuant to subdivision (a) to the extent that funds
18 are provided ~~for~~ in the annual Budget Act.
