An act relating to the Manchester Union Elementary School District.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2894, as introduced, Strom-Martin. Manchester Union Elementary School District.

Existing law sets forth the minimum number of minutes of instruction per grade level that a school district is required to offer to receive incentive funding for a longer instructional day and adjusts that number for school districts that offered a greater number of minutes in the 1982–83 fiscal year.

This bill would exempt the Manchester Union Elementary School District from the provision adjusting the number of minutes of instruction required to be offered by school districts that offered a greater number of minutes in the 1982–83 fiscal year than they would otherwise be required to offer.

The bill would make a finding that a special law is necessary and that a general law cannot be made applicable within the meaning of Section 16 of Article IV of the California Constitution because of the unique circumstances of the Manchester Union Elementary School District.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Commencing with the 2002–03 fiscal year,
2 subdivision (b) of Section 46201 of the Education Code does not
3 apply to the Manchester Union Elementary School District.

4 SEC. 2. The Legislature finds and declares that a special law
5 is necessary and that a general law cannot be made applicable
6 within the meaning of Section 16 of Article IV of the California
7 Constitution because of the unique circumstances of the
8 Manchester Union Elementary School District. The facts
9 constituting the special circumstances concern a change in the
10 district’s pupil transportation arrangements.
