Senate Resolution No. 27—Relative to Senate Rule 12 of the Standing Rules of the Senate for the 2001–02 Regular Session.

1 *Resolved by the Senate of the State of California, That Rule 12*

7 12. The standing committees of the Senate, the number of
8 members, and subjects to be referred to each are set out below. The
9 provisions set forth below as to the assignment of bills are intended
10 as a guide to the Committee on Rules, but are not binding upon the
11 committee.

12 (1) Agriculture and Water Resources, 11 members. Bills
13 relating to agriculture and water supply management.

14 (2) Appropriations, 13 members. Bills that are subject to Joint
15 Rule 10.5 and are not referred to the Budget and Fiscal Review
16 Committee. Bills that constitute a state-mandated local program.

17 (3) *Banking, Commerce and International Trade, 9 members.*
18 *Bills relating to financial institutions, commerce, international*
19 *trade, retail credit interest rates, and corporations.*

20 (4) Budget and Fiscal Review, ~~14~~ 13 members. The Budget
21 Bill and bills implementing the Budget. Bills that directly affect
22 the State Budget, including deficiencies and reappropriations.

- 1 (5) Business and Professions, 7 members. Bills relating to
2 business and professional practices and regulations other than bills
3 relating to horseracing, alcoholic beverages, oil, mining,
4 geothermal, or forestry industries.

- 6 (6) Constitutional Amendments, 5 members. Bills relating to
7 constitutional amendments and constitutional amendments, when
8 favorably reported out of the standing committee having
9 jurisdiction of the subject matter.

- 11 (7) Education, ~~13~~ 14 members. Bills relating to education,
12 higher education, and certificated educational personnel.

- 14 (8) Elections and Reapportionment, ~~5~~ 9 members. Bills
15 relating to elections and reapportionment.

- 17 (9) Energy, Utilities, and Communications, 9 members. Bills
18 relating to utilities, energy companies, alternative energy
19 development and conservation, and communications development
20 and technology.

- 22 (10) Environmental Quality, ~~9~~ 7 members. Bills relating to
23 environmental quality, air quality, water quality, integrated waste
24 management, toxics, and hazardous waste.
25 ~~(10) Finance, Investment and International Trade, 9 members.~~
26 ~~Bills relating to financial institutions, commerce, international~~
27 ~~trade, retail credit interest rates, and corporations.~~
- 28 (11) Governmental Organization, ~~11~~ 13 members. Bills
29 relating to state government organization, horseracing, public
30 gaming, alcoholic beverages, management of public safety
31 emergencies and disaster response, and legislation permitting the
32 use of state-controlled lands. Bills that have been considered by
33 other committees having jurisdiction of the appropriate subject,
34 for consideration of any question relating to state government.
- 35 (12) Health and Human Services, ~~9~~ 12 members. Bills relating
36 to public health, welfare, social services, the blind and disabled,
37 substance abuse, mental health, and institutions related thereto.
- 38 (13) Housing and Community Development, ~~5~~ 7 members.
39 Bills relating to housing and community development.



- 1 (14) Insurance, 9 members. Bills relating to insurance,
2 indemnity, surety, warranty agreements, liens, claims, unclaimed
3 property, collections, and franchises.
- 4 (15) Judiciary, 9 7 members. Bills amending the following:
- 5 (a) Civil Code, except measures related to retail credit interest
6 rates.
- 7 (b) Code of Civil Procedure.
- 8 (c) Evidence Code, except matters relating to criminal
9 procedure.
- 10 (d) Family Code.
- 11 (e) Probate Code.
- 12 (16) Labor and Industrial Relations, 7 8 members. Bills
13 relating to labor, industrial safety, unemployment, workers'
14 compensation and insurance, and noncertificated public school
15 employees.
- 16 (17) Local Government, 9 6 members. Bills relating to local
17 governmental procedure and organization. Bills relating to land
18 use. Bills that have been considered by other committees having
19 jurisdiction of the appropriate subject, for consideration of any
20 questions relating to local government administration.
- 21 (18) Natural Resources and Wildlife, 9 members. Bills relating
22 to conservation and the management of public resources, fish and
23 wildlife, regulation of oil, mining, geothermal development, acid
24 deposition, wetlands and lakes, global atmospheric effects, ocean
25 and bay pollution, forestry practices, recreation, parks, and
26 historical resources, and beverage container recycling.
- 27 (19) *Privacy, 5 members. Bills relating to privacy.*
- 28 (20) Public Employment and Retirement, 5 members. Bills
29 relating to state and local nonschool public employees and public
30 employee retirement.

- 32 (21) Public Safety, 8 6 members. Bills amending the
33 following:
- 34 (a) Evidence Code, relating to criminal procedure.
- 35 (b) Penal Code.
- 36 (c) Statutes of a penal nature not related closely to a subject
37 included in another subdivision of this rule.
- 38 (d) Bills relating to the Youth and Adult Corrections Agency.

1 (21) Revenue and Taxation, 9 6 members. Bills relating to state
2 and local revenues and taxation, except bills described in
3 subdivision (a) of Rule 28.9.

4 (22) Rules, 5 members. Proposed amendments to the rules and
5 other matters relating to the business of the Legislature.

6 (23) Transportation, 9 15 members. Bills relating to the
7 operation, safety, equipment, transfer of ownership, licensing, and
8 registration of vehicles, aircraft, and vessels. Legislation affecting
9 the Department of Transportation and the Department of Motor
10 Vehicles. Bills relating to waterways, harbors, highways, public
11 transportation systems, and airports.

12 (24) Veterans Affairs, 5 members. Bills relating to veterans,
13 military affairs, and armories. Bills amending the Military and
14 Veterans Code.

15 The standing committees of any regular session shall be the
16 standing committees of concurrent special or extraordinary
17 sessions unless otherwise ordered by the Senate.
