SENATE BILL

No. 1889

Introduced by Senator Johannessen

February 22, 2002

An act to add Chapter 2.90 (commencing with Section 7286.47) to Part 1.7 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1889, as amended, Johannessen. Transactions and use tax: Redding.

Existing law authorizes various local governmental entities, in accordance with certain limitations and approval requirements, to levy transactions and use taxes in accordance with the procedures and requirements set forth in the Transactions and Use Tax Law.

This bill would additionally authorize the City of Redding, subject to the approval of a majority of the voters voting on the issue at an election, to levy a transactions and use tax pursuant to the Transactions and Use Tax Law at a rate of 0.25% for general governmental purposes.

This bill would make legislative findings and declarations as to the necessity of a special statute.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 2.90 (commencing with Section
2 7286.47) is added to Part 1.7 of Division 2 of the Revenue and

7 7286.47. (a) Subject to subdivision (b), the City of Redding
8 may levy a transactions and use tax at a rate of 0.25 percent, if an
9 ordinance ~~or resolution~~ proposing that tax is approved by a
10 two-thirds vote of all the members of the city council and the tax
11 is approved by a majority vote of the qualified voters of the city
12 voting in an election on the issue.

13 (b) (1) Any transactions and use tax levied under this section
14 shall be levied pursuant to the Transactions and Use Tax Law (Part
15 1.6 (commencing with Section 7251)).

16 (2) The net revenues derived from a tax levied under this
17 section shall be expended for general governmental purposes.

18 SEC. 2. The Legislature finds and declares that a special law
19 is necessary and that a general law cannot be made applicable
20 within the meaning of Section 16 of Article IV of the California
21 Constitution because of the uniquely difficult fiscal pressures
22 being experienced by the City of Redding in providing essential
23 services and funding for city programs and operations.
