Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 142—Relative to the Los Angeles County Deputy Sheriff David W. March Memorial Interchange.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

ACR 142, as amended, Chavez. Los Angeles County Deputy Sheriff David W. March Memorial Interchange.

This measure would designate the interchange of State Highway Route 605 and State Highway Route 210 as the Los Angeles County Deputy Sheriff David W. March Memorial Interchange. The measure would request the Department of Transportation to determine the cost of appropriate plaques and markers showing the special designation and upon receiving donations from nonstate sources sufficient to cover the cost, to erect appropriate plaques and markers.

- 1 WHEREAS, Of all the promises that America offers, none is
- 2 more precious or illusive than the right to be free from crime and
- 3 violence; and

1 WHEREAS, Californians are indebted every day to our peace  
2 officers, and we pay special tribute to their bravery and dedication  
3 and share in their pain when one of their members is killed in the  
4 line of duty; and

5 WHEREAS, The men and women of law enforcement have the  
6 unenviable task of guaranteeing the public's safety; and it is as  
7 difficult and dangerous as it is important, as evidenced by the  
8 death, at the age of 33, of Deputy David W. March of the Los  
9 Angeles County Sheriff's Department who was killed in the line  
10 of duty on April 29, 2002, in Irwindale while conducting a  
11 "routine" traffic stop; and

12 WHEREAS, Deputy March faithfully served the residents  
13 within the Temple Station patrol area; and

14 WHEREAS, He was a longtime resident of Santa Clarita Valley  
15 and a 1988 graduate of Canyon High School where he played  
16 football and baseball; and

17 WHEREAS, It is appropriate to recognize the hazardous work,  
18 serious responsibility, and strong commitment that Deputy March  
19 willingly accepted during his seven years as a law enforcement  
20 officer; and

21 WHEREAS, Deputy March is remembered as a passionate  
22 husband to his wife, Teri; a loving son to his parents, John and  
23 Barbara March; a caring father to his stepdaughter, Kayla; a  
24 thoughtful sibling to his sister, Erin Hildreth, and brother, John  
25 Russell March; and a man who committed his life, religious  
26 beliefs, and his career to Los Angeles County and the safety of its  
27 residents; now, therefore, be it

28 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California, the Senate*  
29 *thereof concurring,* That the interchange of State Highway Route  
30 605 and State Highway Route 210 be officially designated as the  
31 Los Angeles County Deputy Sheriff David W. March Memorial  
32 Interchange; and be it further

33 *Resolved,* That the Department of Transportation is requested to  
34 determine the cost of appropriate plaques and markers, consistent  
35 with the signing requirements for the state highway system,  
36 showing this special designation, and upon receiving donations  
37 from nonstate sources sufficient to cover that cost, to erect those  
38 plaques and markers; and be it further
