An act to amend Section 51938 of the Education Code, relating to instruction.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1925, as amended, Haynes. Comprehensive sexual health and HIV/AIDS prevention instruction.

The existing California Comprehensive Sexual Health and HIV/AIDS Prevention Education Act, authorizes school districts to provide comprehensive sexual health education, as defined, in any kindergarten to grade 12, inclusive, and ensures that all pupils in grades 7 to 12, inclusive, receive HIV/AIDS prevention education, as defined. Existing law requires a school district to notify the parent or guardian of a pupil about instruction in comprehensive sexual health education and HIV/AIDS prevention and empowers a parent or guardian to excuse his or her pupil from all or part of that instruction.

This bill would require, if the instruction in comprehensive sexual health education and HIV/AIDS prevention will be taught by outside consultants, or if that instruction is to be given in an assembly by guest speakers, a school district to notify the parent or guardian of a pupil about that instruction, as specified, no fewer than 14 days in advance of the instruction.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 51938 of the Education Code is
2 amended to read:

3 51938. A parent or guardian of a pupil has the right to excuse
4 their child from all or part of comprehensive sexual health
5 education, HIV/AIDS prevention education, and assessments
6 related to that education, as follows:

7 (a) At the beginning of each school year, or, for a pupil who
8 enrolls in a school after the beginning of the school year, at the time
9 of that pupil’s enrollment, each school district shall notify the
10 parent or guardian of each pupil about instruction in
11 comprehensive sexual health education and HIV/AIDS prevention
12 education and research on pupil health behaviors and risks planned
13 for the coming year. The notice shall do all of the following:

14 (1) Advise the parent or guardian that written and audiovisual
15 educational materials used in comprehensive sexual health
16 education and HIV/AIDS prevention education are available for
17 inspection.

18 (2) Advise the parent or guardian whether the comprehensive
19 sexual health education or HIV/AIDS prevention education will
20 be taught by school district personnel or by outside consultants. If
21 comprehensive sexual health education or HIV/AIDS prevention
22 education will be taught by outside consultants, or if an assembly
23 will be held to deliver comprehensive sexual health education or
24 HIV/AIDS prevention education by guest speakers, the notice
25 shall include the date of the instruction, the name of the
26 organization or affiliation of each guest speaker, and information
27 stating the right of the parent or guardian to request a copy of this
28 section, Section 51933, and Section 51934. ~~The governing board
29 of each school district, each county board of education, and each
30 county superintendent of schools, as applicable, shall keep on file
31 copies of this section, Section 51933, and Section 51934. If~~
32 arrangements for this instruction are made after the beginning of
33 the school year, notice shall be made by mail or another commonly
34 used method of notification, no fewer than 14 days before the
35 instruction is delivered.



1 (3) Include information explaining the parent’s or guardian’s
2 right to request a copy of this chapter.

3 (4) Advise the parent or guardian that the parent or guardian
4 may request in writing that his or her child not receive
5 comprehensive sexual health education or HIV/AIDS prevention
6 education.

7 (b) Notwithstanding Section 51513, anonymous, voluntary,
8 and confidential research and evaluation tools to measure pupils’
9 health behaviors and risks, including tests, questionnaires, and
10 surveys containing age-appropriate questions about the pupil’s
11 attitudes concerning or practices relating to sex may be
12 administered to any pupil in grades 7 to 12, inclusive, if the parent
13 or guardian is notified in writing that this test, questionnaire, or
14 survey is to be administered and the pupil’s parent or guardian is
15 given the opportunity to review the test, questionnaire, or survey
16 and to request in writing that his or her child not participate.
