LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2900, as introduced, Laird. Employment: discrimination.

Under existing law, it is unlawful to engage in specified discriminatory employment practices, including hiring, promotion, and termination, on the basis of race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, sex, age, or sexual orientation.

This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to address employment discrimination issues.
