SENATE BILL

No. 1546

Introduced by Senator Figueroa

An act to amend Sections 1601.1, 1616.5, ~~1742, 1767, and 1775~~ and ~~1742~~ of, to amend and repeal Sections 1753.5, 1754, 1756, 1757, and 1760 of, to amend, repeal, and add Sections 1741, 1750, 1751, 1752, 1753, 1765, and 1770 of, and to add Sections 1750.1, 1750.2, 1753.1, 1776, and 1777 to, the Business and Professions Code, relating to dentistry, and making an appropriation therefor.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1546, as amended, Figueroa. Dentistry.

Existing law, the Dental Practice Act, provides for the licensure and regulation of the practice of dentistry by the Dental Board of California, and authorizes the board to appoint a person exempt from civil service as an executive officer. Existing law also establishes the Committee on Dental Auxiliaries within the jurisdiction of the board. The provisions establishing the board, authorizing the board to appoint an executive officer, and establishing the committee are repealed as of January 1, 2006.

This bill would change these dates to unspecified dates.

Existing law requires the board to license persons meeting specified requirements as dental assistants and dental assistants in extended functions, and requires the board to enact certain regulations with respect to those licensees. Existing law also describes the functions that those licensees are permitted to perform and imposes specified

requirements on them. Existing law prohibits a dentist from utilizing more than 2 dental auxiliaries in extended functions.

This bill would, on January 1, 2007, revise the requirements imposed on, and the functions that may be performed by, a dental assistant or a dental assistant in extended functions. ~~The bill would make a supervising licensed dentist responsible for assuring that a dental assistant meets certain competency and educational requirements.~~ The bill would also, on and after January 1, 2007, require the board to license a person who meets specified requirements as a registered dental assistant, registered orthodontic assistant, registered surgery assistant, registered restorative assistant, registered dental assistant in extended functions, or registered restorative assistant in extended functions.

This bill would require the board to adopt regulations regarding education and training requirements that those licensees and registered dental hygienists are required to meet and procedures they may perform. The bill would also require the board to report periodically to the Joint Legislative Sunset Review Committee regarding the regulations imposed on licensees. The bill, *on and after January 1, 2007*, would authorize a dentist to utilize up to 3 dental auxiliaries in extended functions. The bill would also make other related changes.

Because this bill would increase the licensing fees deposited into the State Dental Auxiliary Fund, a continuously appropriated fund, it would make an appropriation.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1601.1 of the Business and Professions
 2 Code is amended to read:
 3 1601.1. (a) There shall be in the Department of Consumer
 4 Affairs the Dental Board of California in which the administration
 5 of this chapter is vested. The board shall consist of eight practicing
 6 dentists, one registered dental hygienist, one registered dental
 7 assistant, and four public members. Of the eight practicing
 8 dentists, one shall be a member of a faculty of any California dental
 9 college and one shall be a dentist practicing in a nonprofit
 10 community clinic. The appointing powers, described in Section
 11 1603, may appoint to the board a person who was a member of the
 12 prior board. The board shall be organized into standing



1 committees dealing with examinations, enforcement, and other
2 subjects as the board deems appropriate.

3 (b) For purposes of this chapter, any reference in this chapter
4 to the Board of Dental Examiners shall be deemed to refer to the
5 Dental Board of California.

6 (c) The board shall have all authority previously vested in the
7 existing board under this chapter. The board may enforce all
8 disciplinary actions undertaken by the previous board.

9 (d) This section shall become inoperative on July 1, _____, and,
10 as of January 1, _____, is repealed, unless a later enacted statute that
11 is enacted before January 1, _____, deletes or extends the dates on
12 which it becomes inoperative and is repealed. The repeal of this
13 section renders the board subject to the review required by
14 Division 1.2 (commencing with Section 473).

15 SEC. 2. Section 1616.5 of the Business and Professions Code
16 is amended to read:

17 1616.5. (a) The board, by and with the approval of the
18 director, may appoint a person exempt from civil service who shall
19 be designated as an executive officer and who shall exercise the
20 powers and perform the duties delegated by the board and vested
21 in him or her by this chapter.

22 (b) This section shall become inoperative on July 1, _____, and,
23 as of January 1, _____, is repealed, unless a later enacted statute that
24 is enacted before January 1, _____, deletes or extends the dates on
25 which it becomes inoperative and is repealed.

26 SEC. 3. Section 1741 of the Business and Professions Code
27 is amended to read:

28 1741. As used in this article:

29 (a) "Board" means the Dental Board of California.

30 (b) "Committee" means the Committee on Dental Auxiliaries.

31 (c) "Direct supervision" means supervision of dental
32 procedures based on instructions given by a licensed dentist, who
33 must be physically present in the treatment facility during the
34 performance of those procedures.

35 (d) "General supervision" means supervision of dental
36 procedures based on instructions given by a licensed dentist but not
37 requiring the physical presence of the supervising dentist during
38 the performance of those procedures.

39 (e) "Dental auxiliary" means a person who may perform
40 dental assisting or dental hygiene procedures authorized by this



1 article. Dental auxiliary also means a registered dental hygienist
2 in alternative practice, who may provide authorized services by
3 prescription provided by a dentist or physician and surgeon
4 licensed to practice in this state. “Dental auxiliary” includes all of
5 the following:

6 (1) A dental assistant pursuant to Section 1750.

7 (2) A registered dental assistant pursuant to Section 1753.

8 (3) A registered dental assistant in extended functions pursuant
9 to Section 1756.

10 (4) A registered dental hygienist pursuant to Section 1766.

11 (5) A registered dental hygienist in extended functions
12 pursuant to Section 1768.

13 (6) A registered dental hygienist in alternative practice
14 pursuant to Section 1774.

15 (f) This section shall become inoperative on December 31,
16 2006, and, as of January 1, 2007, is repealed, unless a later enacted
17 statute, that is enacted before January 1, 2007, deletes or extends
18 the dates on which it becomes inoperative and is repealed.

19 SEC. 4. Section 1741 is added to the Business and Professions
20 Code, to read:

21 1741. As used in this article the following terms have the
22 following meanings:

23 (a) “Board” means the Dental Board of California.

24 (b) “Committee” means the Committee on Dental Auxiliaries.

25 (c) “Direct supervision” means supervision of dental
26 procedures based on instructions given by a licensed dentist, who
27 must be physically present in the treatment facility during the
28 performance of those procedures.

29 (d) “General supervision” means supervision of dental
30 procedures based on instructions given by a licensed dentist but not
31 requiring the physical presence of the supervising dentist during
32 the performance of those procedures.

33 (e) “Dental auxiliary” means a person who may perform
34 dental assisting or dental hygiene procedures authorized by this
35 article. Dental auxiliary also means a registered dental hygienist
36 in alternative practice, who may provide authorized services by
37 prescription provided by a dentist or physician and surgeon
38 licensed to practice in this state. “Dental auxiliary” includes all of
39 the following:

40 (1) A dental assistant pursuant to Section 1750.



1 (2) A registered orthodontic assistant, a registered surgery
2 assistant, a registered restorative assistant, or a registered dental
3 assistant pursuant to Section 1750.2.

4 (3) A registered restorative dental assistant in extended
5 functions pursuant to Section 1752.

6 (4) A registered dental assistant in extended functions pursuant
7 to Section 1752.

8 (5) A registered dental hygienist pursuant to Section 1766.

9 (6) A registered dental hygienist in extended functions
10 pursuant to Section 1768.

11 (7) A registered dental hygienist in alternative practice
12 pursuant to Section 1774.

13 (f) This section shall become operative on January 1, 2007.

14 SEC. 5. Section 1742 of the Business and Professions Code
15 is amended to read:

16 1742. (a) There is within the jurisdiction of the board a
17 Committee on Dental Auxiliaries.

18 (b) The Committee on Dental Auxiliaries shall have the
19 following areas of responsibility and duties:

20 (1) The committee shall have the following duties and
21 authority related to education programs and curriculum:

22 (A) Shall evaluate all dental auxiliary programs applying for
23 board approval in accordance with board rules governing the
24 programs.

25 (B) May appoint board members to any evaluation committee.
26 Board members so appointed shall not make a final decision on the
27 issue of program or course approval.

28 (C) Shall report and make recommendations to the board as to
29 whether a program or course qualifies for approval. The board
30 retains the final authority to grant or deny approval to a program
31 or course.

32 (D) Shall review and document any alleged deficiencies that
33 might warrant board action to withdraw or revoke approval of a
34 program or course, at the request of the board.

35 (E) May review and document any alleged deficiencies that
36 might warrant board action to withdraw or revoke approval of a
37 program or course, at its own initiation.

38 (2) The committee shall have the following duties and
39 authority related to applications:



1 (A) Shall review and evaluate all applications for licensure in
2 the various dental auxiliary categories to ascertain whether a
3 candidate meets the appropriate licensing requirements specified
4 by statute and board regulations.

5 (B) Shall maintain application records, cashier application
6 fees, and perform any other ministerial tasks as are incidental to
7 the application process.

8 (C) May delegate any or all of the functions in this paragraph
9 to its staff.

10 (D) Shall issue auxiliary licenses in all cases, except where
11 there is a question as to a licensing requirement. The board retains
12 final authority to interpret any licensing requirement. If a question
13 arises in the area of interpreting any licensing requirement, it shall
14 be presented by the committee to the board for resolution.

15 (3) The committee shall have the following duties and
16 authority regarding examinations:

17 (A) Shall advise the board as to the type of license examination
18 it deems appropriate for the various dental auxiliary license
19 categories.

20 (B) Shall, at the direction of the board, develop or cause to be
21 developed, administer, or both, examinations in accordance with
22 the board's instructions and periodically report to the board on the
23 progress of those examinations. The following shall apply to the
24 examination procedure:

25 (i) The examination shall be submitted to the board for its
26 approval prior to its initial administration.

27 (ii) Once an examination has been approved by the board, no
28 further approval is required unless a major modification is made
29 to the examination.

30 (iii) The committee shall report to the board on the results of
31 each examination and shall, where appropriate, recommend pass
32 points.

33 (iv) The board shall set pass points for all dental auxiliary
34 licensing examinations.

35 (C) May appoint board members to any examination
36 committee established pursuant to subparagraph (B).

37 (4) The committee shall periodically report and make
38 recommendations to the board concerning the level of fees for
39 dental auxiliaries and the need for any legislative fee increase.
40 However, the board retains final authority to set all fees.



1 (5) The committee shall be responsible for all aspects of the
2 license renewal process, which shall be accomplished in
3 accordance with this chapter and board regulations. The
4 committee may delegate any or all of its functions under this
5 paragraph to its staff.

6 (6) The committee shall have no authority with respect to the
7 approval of continuing education providers; the board retains all
8 of this authority.

9 (7) The committee shall advise the board as to appropriate
10 standards of conduct for auxiliaries, the proper ordering of
11 enforcement priorities, and any other enforcement-related matters
12 that the board may, in the future, delegate to the committee. The
13 board shall retain all authority with respect to the enforcement
14 actions, including, but not limited to, complaint resolution,
15 investigation, and disciplinary action against auxiliaries.

16 (8) The committee shall have the following duties regarding
17 regulations:

18 (A) To review and evaluate all suggestions or requests for
19 regulatory changes related to dental auxiliaries.

20 (B) To report and make recommendations to the board, after
21 consultation with departmental legal counsel and the board's
22 executive officer.

23 (C) To include in any report regarding a proposed regulatory
24 change, at a minimum, the specific language of the proposed
25 changes and the reasons for and facts supporting the need for the
26 change. The board has the final rulemaking authority.

27 (c) This section shall become inoperative on July 1, _____, and,
28 as of January 1, _____, is repealed, unless a later enacted statute
29 which becomes effective on or before January 1, _____, deletes or
30 extends the dates on which it becomes inoperative and is repealed.
31 The repeal of this section renders the committee subject to the
32 review required by Division 1.2 (commencing with Section 473).

33 SEC. 6. Section 1750 of the Business and Professions Code
34 is amended to read:

35 1750. (a) A dental assistant is a person who may perform
36 basic supportive dental procedures as authorized by this article
37 under the supervision of a licensed dentist and who may perform
38 basic supportive procedures as authorized pursuant to subdivision
39 (b) of Section 1751 under the supervision of a registered dental
40 hygienist in alternative practice.



1 (b) This section shall become inoperative on December 31,
2 2006, and, as of January 1, 2007, is repealed, unless a later enacted
3 statute, that is enacted before January 1, 2007, deletes or extends
4 the dates on which it becomes inoperative and is repealed.

5 SEC. 7. Section 1750 is added to the Business and Professions
6 Code, to read:

7 1750. (a) A dental assistant is an individual who, without a
8 license, may perform basic supportive dental procedures, as
9 authorized by this article and the board pursuant to this article,
10 under the supervision of a licensed dentist. “Basic supportive
11 dental procedures” are those procedures that have technically
12 elementary characteristics, are completely reversible, and are
13 unlikely to precipitate potentially hazardous conditions for the
14 patient being treated. These basic supportive dental procedures
15 may be performed under general supervision. These basic
16 supportive dental procedures do not include those procedures
17 authorized in Section 1750.2 or Section 1753.2, or by the board
18 pursuant to Section 1751.

19 (b) The supervising licensed dentist shall be responsible for
20 determining the competency of the dental assistant to perform
21 authorized and approved basic supportive dental procedures.

22 (c) The supervising licensed dentist shall be responsible for
23 assuring that each dental assistant, registered orthodontic
24 assistant, registered surgery assistant, registered restorative dental
25 assistant, registered dental assistant, and registered dental assistant
26 in extended functions, who is in his or her continuous employ for
27 120 days or more, has completed the following courses:

28 (1) A course in patient protection, consisting of infection
29 control procedures and other relevant California law that is
30 approved by the board.

31 (2) A basic life support course offered by the American Red
32 Cross, the American Heart Association, or any other course
33 approved by the board as equivalent.

34 (3) Prior to operating radiographic equipment or applying for
35 registration as a registered dental assistant under Section 1750.2,
36 a radiation safety course approved by the board.

37 (d) This section shall become operative on January 1, 2007.

38 SEC. 8. Section 1750.1 is added to the Business and
39 Professions Code, to read:



1 1750.1. (a) The practice of dental assisting does not include
2 any of the following procedures:

3 (1) Diagnosis and comprehensive treatment planning.

4 (2) Placing, finishing, or removing permanent restorations,
5 except as provided in Section 1753.2.

6 (3) Surgery or cutting on hard and soft tissue including, but not
7 limited to, the removal of teeth and the cutting and suturing of soft
8 tissue.

9 (4) Prescribing medication.

10 (5) Starting or adjusting local or general anesthesia or oral or
11 parenteral conscious sedation, except for the administration of
12 nitrous oxide and oxygen, whether administered alone or in
13 combination with each other and except as otherwise provided in
14 this article.

15 (b) This section shall become operative on January 1, 2007.

16 SEC. 9. Section 1750.2 is added to the Business and
17 Professions Code, to read:

18 1750.2. (a) The board shall license as a “registered
19 orthodontic assistant,” “registered surgery assistant,” “registered
20 restorative assistant,” or “registered dental assistant” any person
21 who submits written evidence of satisfactory completion of a
22 course or courses approved by the board pursuant to subdivision
23 (c) that qualifies him or her in one of those specialty areas of
24 practice, as described in this section.

25 (b) The board shall adopt regulations for the approval of
26 licensing program curricula and training in the specialty and
27 registered dental assisting areas specified in this section.

28 (c) The board shall define the minimum education and training
29 requirements necessary to achieve proficiency in the procedures
30 appropriate to each specialty module listed in subdivision (a),
31 taking into account the combinations of classroom and practical
32 instruction, clinical training, and supervised work experience that
33 are most likely to provide the greatest number of opportunities for
34 improving dental assisting skills efficiently.

35 (d) A registered orthodontic assistant may perform all of the
36 following dental procedures, consistent with regulations adopted
37 pursuant to Section 1751:

38 (1) Any duties that a dental assistant may perform.

39 (2) Placing and removing orthodontic separators.

40 (3) Placing and removing ligatures and arch wires.



- 1 (4) Taking orthodontic impressions.
- 2 (5) Sizing, fitting, adjusting, repositioning, curing in a
- 3 position approved by the supervising dentist, and removal of
- 4 orthodontic bands and brackets.
- 5 (6) Coronal polishing.
- 6 (7) Removing excess cement from supragingival surfaces of
- 7 teeth.
- 8 (8) Preparing teeth for bonding.
- 9 (9) Activating bleaching agents with nonlaser, light-curing
- 10 devices.
- 11 (e) A registered surgery assistant may perform the following
- 12 dental procedures, consistent with regulations adopted pursuant to
- 13 Section 1751:
- 14 (1) Any duties that a dental assistant may perform.
- 15 (2) Monitoring of patients during the preoperative,
- 16 intraoperative, and postoperative phases, using noninvasive
- 17 instrumentation such as pulse oximeters, electrocardiograms, and
- 18 capnography.
- 19 (3) Taking impressions for surgical splints and occlusal guards.
- 20 (4) Placement and removal of surgical dressings and removal
- 21 of sutures.
- 22 (5) Adding medications to intravenous lines, in the presence of
- 23 a licensed dentist.
- 24 (6) Removal of intravenous lines.
- 25 (f) A registered restorative assistant may perform all of the
- 26 following dental procedures, consistent with regulations adopted
- 27 pursuant to Section 1751:
- 28 (1) Sizing, fitting, adjusting, intraorally fabricating,
- 29 temporarily cementing, and removing temporary crowns.
- 30 (2) Placing bases and liners on sound dentin.
- 31 (3) Removing excess cement from supragingival surfaces of
- 32 teeth.
- 33 (4) Taking facebow transfers and bite registrations for
- 34 diagnostic models for case study only.
- 35 (5) Taking impressions for space-maintaining appliances and
- 36 occlusal guards.
- 37 (6) Coronal polishing.
- 38 (7) Applying pit and fissure sealants.
- 39 (8) Placing and removing temporary restorations.



1 (9) Activating bleaching agents with nonlaser, light-curing
2 devices.

3 (g) A registered dental assistant may perform all duties and
4 procedures that a dental assistant, a registered orthodontic
5 assistant, a registered surgery assistant, and a registered restorative
6 assistant may perform, consistent with regulations adopted
7 pursuant to Section 1751.

8 (h) The supervising dentist shall be responsible for determining
9 the level of supervision required for assistants registered pursuant
10 to this section.

11 (i) A person who holds a license as a registered orthodontic
12 assistant, registered surgery assistant, or registered restorative
13 assistant shall be subject to continuing education requirements
14 established by the board pursuant to Section 1645 and the renewal
15 requirements of Article 6 (commencing with Section 1715).

16 (j) A person who holds a license as a registered orthodontic
17 assistant, a registered surgery assistant, and a registered restorative
18 assistant, and who satisfies applicable continuing education
19 requirements established by the board pursuant to Section 1645,
20 is qualified to apply for, and shall be licensed as, a registered dental
21 assistant. A person holding a license as a registered dental assistant
22 shall be subject to the renewal requirements of Article 6
23 (commencing with Section 1715).

24 (k) This section shall become operative on January 1, 2007.

25 SEC. 10. Section 1751 of the Business and Professions Code
26 is amended to read:

27 1751. (a) By September 15, 1993, the board, upon
28 recommendation of the committee, consistent with this article,
29 standards of good dental practice, and the health and welfare of
30 patients, shall adopt regulations relating to the functions that may
31 be performed by dental assistants under direct or general
32 supervision, and the settings within which dental assistants may
33 work. At least once every seven years thereafter, the board shall
34 review the list of functions performable by dental assistants, the
35 supervision level, and settings under which they may be
36 performed, and shall update the regulations as needed to keep them
37 current with the state of the practice.

38 (b) Under the supervision of a registered dental hygienist in
39 alternative practice, a dental assistant may perform intraoral
40 retraction and suctioning.



1 (c) This section shall become inoperative on December 31,
2 2006, and, as of January 1, 2007, is repealed, unless a later enacted
3 statute, that is enacted before January 1, 2007, deletes or extends
4 the dates on which it becomes inoperative and is repealed.

5 SEC. 11. Section 1751 is added to the Business and
6 Professions Code, to read:

7 1751. (a) The board shall adopt regulations governing the
8 procedures that dental assistants, registered orthodontic assistants,
9 registered surgery assistants, registered restorative assistants,
10 registered dental assistants, registered restorative assistants in
11 extended functions, and registered dental assistants in extended
12 functions are authorized to perform consistent with the provisions
13 of this article, and the settings within which each may practice.

14 (b) The board shall conduct an initial review of the procedures,
15 supervision level, settings under which they may be performed,
16 and utilization of extended functions dental auxiliaries by January
17 1, 2011. The board shall submit the results of its review to the Joint
18 Legislative Sunset Review Committee. After the initial review, a
19 review shall be conducted at least once every five years thereafter
20 and the board shall update regulations as necessary to keep them
21 current with the state of dental practice.

22 (c) This section shall become operative on January 1, 2007.

23 SEC. 12. Section 1752 of the Business and Professions Code
24 is amended to read:

25 1752. (a) The supervising licensed dentist shall be
26 responsible for determining the competency of the dental assistant
27 to perform allowable functions.

28 (b) This section shall become inoperative on December 31,
29 2006, and, as of January 1, 2007, is repealed, unless a later enacted
30 statute, that is enacted before January 1, 2007, deletes or extends
31 the dates on which it becomes inoperative and is repealed.

32 SEC. 13. Section 1752 is added to the Business and
33 Professions Code, to read:

34 1752. (a) A “registered dental assistant in extended
35 functions” is an individual licensed pursuant to this article who
36 may perform all dental procedures authorized by Section 1750 and
37 subdivision (g) of Section 1750.2, and by the board pursuant to
38 Section 1753.1, and who may provide basic restorative services
39 and direct patient care under the supervision of a licensed dentist.



1 (b) A “registered restorative assistant in extended functions”
2 is an individual licensed pursuant to this article who may perform
3 all dental procedures authorized by Section 1750, subdivision (f)
4 of Section 1750.2, and by the board pursuant to this article, and
5 who may provide basic restorative services, as authorized by
6 Section 1753.1 and by the board pursuant to this article, under the
7 supervision of a licensed dentist.

8 (c) This section shall become operative on January 1, 2007.

9 SEC. 14. Section 1753 of the Business and Professions Code
10 is amended to read:

11 1753. (a) The board shall license as a registered dental
12 assistant a person who submits written evidence, satisfactory to the
13 board, of either one of the following requirements:

14 (1) Graduation from an educational program in dental assisting
15 approved by the board, and satisfactory performance on a written
16 examination required by the board. On and after January 1, 1984,
17 an applicant seeking licensure as a registered dental assistant
18 pursuant to this subdivision shall provide evidence of his or her
19 satisfactory performance on a written and practical examination
20 required by the board.

21 (2) Satisfactory work experience of more than 12 months as a
22 dental assistant in California or another state and satisfactory
23 performance on a written and practical examination required by
24 the board. The board shall give credit toward the 12 months work
25 experience referred to in this subdivision to persons who have
26 graduated from a dental assisting program in a postsecondary
27 institution approved by the Department of Education or in a
28 secondary institution, regional occupational center, or regional
29 occupational program, that are not, however, approved by the
30 board pursuant to subdivision (a). The credit shall equal the total
31 weeks spent in classroom training and internship on a
32 week-for-week basis not to exceed 16 weeks. The board, in
33 cooperation with the Superintendent of Public Instruction, shall
34 establish the minimum criteria for the curriculum of
35 nonboard-approved programs. Additionally, the board shall notify
36 those programs only if the program’s curriculum does not meet
37 established minimum criteria, as established for board-approved
38 registered dental assistant programs, except any requirement that
39 the program be given in a postsecondary institution. Graduates of



1 programs not meeting established minimum criteria shall not
2 qualify for satisfactory work experience as defined by this section.

3 (b) This section shall become inoperative on December 31,
4 2006, and, as of January 1, 2007, is repealed, unless a later enacted
5 statute, that is enacted before January 1, 2007, deletes or extends
6 the dates on which it becomes inoperative and is repealed.

7 SEC. 15. Section 1753 is added to the Business and
8 Professions Code, to read:

9 1753. (a) The board shall license as a registered dental
10 assistant in extended functions a person who submits written
11 evidence, satisfactory to the board, of either of the following:

12 (1) That he or she has completed all of the following
13 requirements:

14 (A) Has graduated from an educational program in dental
15 assisting approved by the board that provides training in registered
16 dental assisting and all of the procedures specified in Section
17 1750.2.
