Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 122—Relative to David Grant USAF Medical Center.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SCR 122, as introduced, Denham. David Grant USAF Medical Center.

This measure would recognize David Grant USAF Medical Center and its command as an important segment of the United States Armed Forces.

1 WHEREAS, David Grant USAF Medical Center at Travis Air  
2 Force Base in Fairfield, California, will be celebrating its 53rd  
3 anniversary in 2006; and

4 WHEREAS, This military medical treatment facility is  
5 recognized by the medical community as an outstanding training  
6 facility that is utilized in the training of interns in all medical  
7 specialities by many California universities, including, but not  
8 limited to, the University of California at Davis, the University of  
9 California at Los Angeles, and the University of California at San  
10 Francisco; and

11 WHEREAS, In its 53 years of existence, David Grant USAF  
12 Medical Center has treated countless thousands of active duty  
13 military persons and their dependents, retired military persons  
14 and their dependents, and widows of retired military persons of  
15 all the United States armed services, including the Army, Air  
16 Force, Marines, and Coast Guard; and

1 WHEREAS, David Grant USAF Medical Center has been  
2 accredited by the highest accrediting agencies in the government,  
3 and continues to maintain and surpass the quality of medical care  
4 demanded of armed services medical personnel; and

5 WHEREAS, David Grant USAF Medical Center is recognized  
6 for its outstanding contribution to Operation Provide Promise,  
7 where 175 medical personnel were deployed to Zagreb, Croatia,  
8 in 1995; for its participation in Operation Uphold Democracy,  
9 where personnel were deployed to Cuba; for its support of  
10 Operation Phoenix Scorpion IV in the Persian Gulf region; for its  
11 deployment of 40 medical personnel to Prince Sultan Air Base in  
12 Saudi Arabia in Operation Southern Watch; and for its most  
13 recent deployments of 228 medical personnel in support of  
14 Operation Enduring Freedom, of 486 medical personnel in  
15 support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, and of 319 medical  
16 personnel in support of humanitarian efforts and military  
17 operations other than war in relief of the Indian Ocean Tsunami  
18 of December 2004 and Hurricane Katrina in August 2005; and

19 WHEREAS, David Grant USAF Medical Center takes great  
20 pride in the mission statement of the Air Mobility Command:  
21 “The Air Mobility Team ... Responsive Global Reach for  
22 America ... Every Day;” now, therefore, be it

23 *Resolved by the Senate of the State of California, the Assembly*  
24 *thereof concurring*, That the Legislature recognizes David Grant  
25 USAF Medical Center and its outstanding command as an  
26 important segment of America’s Armed Forces, and takes  
27 pleasure in commending the David Grant USAF Medical Center  
28 and its commanders, both past and present, for the contributions  
29 they have made to world peace, America’s freedom, and the way  
30 of life enjoyed by the people of the State of California; and be it

32 *Resolved*, That the Secretary of the Senate transmit copies of  
33 this resolution to David Grant USAF Medical Center at Travis  
34 Air Force Base and the Air Mobility Command at Scott Air  
35 Force Base.
