An act relating to housing.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1252, as introduced, Caballero. Housing Urban-Suburban-and-Rural Parks Account.

The Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund Act of 2006 authorizes the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$2,850,000,000 pursuant to the State General Obligation Bond Law. Proceeds from the sale of these bonds are required to be used to finance various existing housing programs, capital outlay related to infill development, brownfield cleanup that promotes infill development, and housing-related parks. The act establishes the Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund of 2006 in the State Treasury, requires the sum of \$200,000,000 to be deposited in the Housing Urban-Suburban-and-Rural Parks Account, which the act establishes in the fund, and makes the money in the account available, upon appropriation, for housing-related parks grants in urban, suburban, and rural areas, subject to the conditions and criteria that the Legislature may provide in statute.

This bill would set forth the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation governing project eligibility and the application process for projects funded with funds from the Housing Urban-Suburban-and-Rural Parks Account.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. It is the intent of the Legislature to enact
2 legislation governing project eligibility and the application process
3 for projects funded with funds derived from the bonds issued under
4 the Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund Act of 2006,
5 deposited in the Housing Urban-Suburban-and-Rural Parks
6 Account in the Housing and Emergency Shelter Trust Fund of
7 2006, and made available, upon appropriation, pursuant to
8 subdivision (d) of Section 53545 of the Health and Safety Code,
9 for expenditure for housing-related parks grants in urban, suburban,
10 and rural areas.
