## LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2114, as amended, Villines. The Corporation Tax Law: allocation and apportionment.

The Corporation Tax Law imposes taxes measured by income and, in the case of a business with income derived from, or attributable to, sources both within and without this state, apportions the income between this state and other states and foreign countries in accordance with a specified 4-factor formula, except as otherwise provided.

This bill would-declare the Legislature's intent to enact legislation that would, for purposes of apportionment of income in computing income taxes of apportioning trades or businesses, modify the sales factor in a manner to retain and attract businesses to, and create jobs in, California require the Department of Finance to conduct a study to determine the impact of a change in current law, addressing the apportionment of income in computing the corporate income taxes of trades or businesses, that would modify the sales factor in a manner best suited to retaining and attracting businesses to, and creating new jobs in, California.

SECTION 1.
