An act relating to air pollution.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2655, as introduced, DeSaulnier. Indoor air pollution.

Existing law generally designates the State Air Resources Board as the state agency with the primary responsibility for the control of vehicular air pollution, and air pollution control districts and air quality management districts with the primary responsibility for the control of air pollution from all sources other than vehicular sources. The state board is required to develop and adopt regulations, consistent with federal law and including specified elements, to protect public health from ozone emitted by indoor air cleaning devices, including both medical and nonmedical devices, used in occupied spaces. The state board is also required to undertake a study meeting specified requirements on indoor air pollution.

This bill would declare legislative intent to direct the State Air Resources Board to develop a comprehensive program to protect indoor air quality.
