An act to amend Section 44230.5 of the Education Code, relating to teacher credentialing.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 363, as amended, Simitian. Teacher credentialing: identification number.

The Teacher Credentialing Law of 1988 requires the Commission-for on Teacher–Preparation and Licensing Credentialing to establish professional standards, assessments, and examinations for entry and advancement in the education profession. Existing law requires the commission to establish a nonpersonally identifiable teacher identification number for each teacher to whom it issues a credential, certificate, permit or other document to teach in the public schools.

This bill instead would require the commission to establish a nonpersonally identifiable educator identification number for each educator to whom it issues a credential to provide a service in the public schools. *The bill would prohibit the commission from disclosing the nonpersonally identifiable educator identification number, except to specified entities, in accordance with certain requirements.*
