An act relating to juveniles.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 902, as introduced, Padilla. Juvenile justice programs.

Existing law establishes in each county treasury a Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Fund (SLESF) and requires that moneys from this fund be allocated to counties and cities located within a county in accordance with specified requirements for, among other things, front line law enforcement services. Existing law defines front line law enforcement services to include juvenile justice programs and allocates 50% of SLESF moneys to counties and cities and counties to implement a comprehensive multiagency juvenile justice plan with specified components and objectives.

This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to increase funding to juvenile justice programs established pursuant to these provisions.

- 5 Act of 2000.
