An act to amend Section 13102 of the Government Code, relating to state infrastructure.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1557, as introduced, Wiggins. State infrastructure: Governor's plan.

Existing law requires the Governor to submit to the Legislature annually, in conjunction with the Governor's Budget, a proposed 5-year infrastructure plan, to contain specified components.

This bill would make technical, nonsubstantive changes to these provisions.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: no. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 13102 of the Government Code is
- 2 amended to read:
- 3 13102. In conjunction with the Governor's Budget submitted
- 4 pursuant to Section 13337, the Governor shall submit annually a
- 5 proposed five-year infrastructure plan to the Legislature. This plan
- 6 shall cover a five-fiscal-year period beginning with the fiscal year
- 7 that is the same as that covered by the Governor's Budget with
- 8 which it is being submitted.
- 9 The infrastructure plan shall contain the following information
- 10 for the five years that it covers:

1 (a) (1) Identification of new, rehabilitated, modernized,
2 improved, or renovated infrastructure requested by state agencies.

3 (2) Aggregate funding for transportation as identified in the
4 four-year State Transportation Improvement Program Fund
5 Estimate prepared pursuant to Sections 14524 and 14525.

6 (3) Infrastructure needs for Kindergarten through grade 12 public
7 schools necessary to accommodate increased enrollment, class
8 size reduction, and school modernization.

9 (4) The instructional and instructional support facilities needs
10 for the University of California, the California State University,
11 and the California Community Colleges.

12 (b) The estimated cost of providing the infrastructure identified
13 in subdivision (a).

14 (c) A proposal for funding the infrastructure identified in
15 subdivision (a), that includes all of the following:

16 (1) Criteria and priorities used to identify and select the
17 infrastructure it ~~does propose~~ *proposes* to fund, including criteria
18 used to identify and select infrastructure that by January 1, 2005,
19 shall be consistent with the state planning priorities specified
20 pursuant to Section 65041.1 for infrastructure requested by state
21 agencies pursuant to paragraph (1) of subdivision (a).

22 (2) Sources of funding, including, but not limited to, *the* General
23 Fund, state special funds, federal funds, general obligation bonds,
24 lease revenue bonds, and installment purchases.

25 (3) An evaluation of the impact of the new state debt on the
26 state's existing overall debt position if the plan proposes the
27 issuance of new state debt.

28 (4) (A) Recommended specific projects for funding or the
29 recommended type and amount of infrastructure to be funded in
30 order to meet programmatic objectives that shall be identified in
31 the proposal.

32 (B) Any capital outlay or local assistance appropriations
33 intended to fund infrastructure included in the Governor's Budget
34 shall derive from, and be encompassed by, the funding proposal
35 contained in the plan.
