Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 126—Relative to the El Salvador Community Corridor.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

ACR 126, as introduced, Davis. El Salvador Community Corridor.

This measure would recognize the Los Angeles area located between Adams Boulevard and 11th Street on Vermont Boulevard as the El Salvador Community Corridor.

1 WHEREAS, The City of Los Angeles, which represents over
2 three million residents and prides itself in cultural diversity, aims
3 to include all of its citizens in community affairs; and

4 WHEREAS, Located in southern California, Los Angeles is one
5 of the world's major global cities, and is a hub of shipping,
6 manufacturing, and financial industries. Los Angeles is also
7 world-renowned in the entertainment and communications fields;
8 and

9 WHEREAS, Los Angeles is one of only two United States cities
10 without a majority population. People from 140 countries, who
11 speak approximately 86 languages, currently call Los Angeles
12 home; and

13 WHEREAS, Los Angeles is home to over 500,000 El
14 Salvadorans, who have contributed to improving the quality of life

1 in the great City of Los Angeles. A large majority of the city's El
2 Salvadoran population resides in the Pico Union area of Los
3 Angeles; now, therefore, be it

4 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California, the Senate*
5 *thereof concurring,* That the State of California recognizes the Los
6 Angeles area between Adams Boulevard and 11th Street on
7 Vermont Boulevard as the El Salvador Community Corridor; and
8 be it further

9 *Resolved,* That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly transmit copies
10 of this resolution to the author for appropriate distribution.
