Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 126—Relative to the El Salvador Community Corridor.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

ACR 126, as amended, Davis. El Salvador Community Corridor.

This measure would recognize the area between Adams Boulevard and 11th Street on Vermont Avenue in the City of Los Angeles as the El Salvador Community Corridor. The measure would also request the Department of Transportation to determine the cost for appropriate signs showing this special designation and, upon (1) receiving donations from nonstate sources covering that cost and (2) *the department's determination that specified conditions have been satisfied*, to erect those signs at the Vermont Avenue exits on State Highway Route 10.

Fiscal committee: yes.

- 1 WHEREAS, The City of Los Angeles, which represents over
- 2 three million residents and prides itself in cultural diversity, aims
- 3 to include all of its citizens in community affairs; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Located in southern California, Los Angeles is one
- 5 of the world's major global cities, and is a hub of shipping,

1 manufacturing, and financial industries. Los Angeles is also
2 world-renowned in the entertainment and communications fields;
3 and

4 WHEREAS, Los Angeles is one of only two United States cities
5 without a majority population. People from 140 countries, who
6 speak approximately 86 languages, currently call Los Angeles
7 home; and

8 WHEREAS, Los Angeles is home to over 500,000 El
9 Salvadorans, who have contributed to improving the quality of life
10 in the great City of Los Angeles. A large majority of the city's El
11 Salvadoran population resides in the Pico Union area of Los
12 Angeles; now, therefore, be it

13 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California, the Senate*
14 *thereof concurring,* That the Legislature recognizes the area
15 between Adams Boulevard and 11th Street on Vermont Avenue
16 in the City of Los Angeles as the El Salvador Community Corridor;
17 and be it further

18 *Resolved,* That the Department of Transportation is requested
19 to determine the cost of appropriate signs, consistent with the
20 signing requirements for the state highway system, showing this
21 special designation and, upon (1) receiving donations from nonstate
22 sources sufficient to cover that cost and (2) the determination by
23 the department that all of the conditions set forth in Section 101.12
24 of the Streets and Highways Code have been satisfied, to erect
25 those signs at the eastbound and westbound exits to Vermont
26 Avenue on State Highway Route 10; and be it further

27 *Resolved,* That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly transmit copies
28 of this resolution to the author and the Department of
29 Transportation for appropriate distribution.
