# Introduced by Assembly Member Torlakson 

February 26, 2009

An act to-amend Section 51746.5 of, and to add Seetion 46300.8 to, add Section 46300.8 to the Education Code, relating to school attendance.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST
AB 837, as amended, Torlakson. School attendance: online education. (1) Existing

Existing law establishes the public elementary and secondary school system in this state, and further establishes a funding system pursuant to which the state apportions funds to local educational agencies based on the average daily attendance of pupils at the schools operated by those agencies. Numerous statutes and regulations govern the calculation and reporting of average daily attendance.
This bill would provide that school districts, county offices of education, and charter schools that offer online education courses may claim a-pereentage unit of average daily attendance-based on the pereentage of the sehoolday that on the basis of the attendance of a pupil taking at least one online course-spends at a class or classes in a classroom-based setting.
(2) Existing law requires that the ratio of average daily attendance for independent study pupils 18 years of age or less to sehool distriet or eotuly office of edtreation full-time equivalent eertificated employees responsible for independent study not exeeed specified ratios.

This bill would authorize, with respect to a pupil who is enrelled for at least the minimum sehoolday through classes that inelude both a elassroom-based setting and at least one elass offered through an online program, a sehool distriet, county office of edueation, or eharter sehool to demonstrate compliance with this provision by certifying to the Superintendent of Publie Instruction that at least $85 \%$ of the average daily attendanee revente generated by that pupil is expended for instructional purposes.

## The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 46300.8 is added to the Education Code, to read:
46300.8. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in order to facilitate the access of pupils to high-quality online course offerings, when a pupil is enrolled for the minimum schoolday through classes that include both a classroom-based setting and at least one class offered through an online program, the school district, county office of education, or charter school may claim, for that pupil, a pereentage of average daily attendanee that is equal to the pereentage of that pupil's sehoolday spent in the unit of average daily attendance on the basis of that pupil's attendance at a class or classes in the classroom-based setting.

SEC. 2. Seetion 51745.6 of the Edueation Code is amended to reat:
51745.6. (a) The ratio of average daily attendance for independent study pupils 18 years of age or less to sehool distriet full-time equivalent certifieated employees responsible for independent study, ealeulated as speeified by the State Department of Edueation, shall not exeeed the equivalent ratio of pupils to full-time certifieated employees for all other edtreational programs eperated by the sehool distriet. The ratio of average daily attendanee for independent study pupils 18 years of age or less to eounty office of edtueation full-time equivalent certifieated employees responsible for independent study, to be ealeulated in a manner preseribed by the State Department of Edueation, shall not exceed the equivalent ratio of pupils to full-time certiffeated employees for all other edueational programs operated by the high
sehool or unified sehool distriet with the largest average daily attendanee of pupils in that eounty. The computation of those ratios shall be performed anntally by the reporting ageney at the time of, and in connection with, the second prineipal apportionment report to the Superintendent.
(b) Only those units of average daily attendanee for independent study that reflect a pupil-teacher ratio that does not exeeed the ratio described in subdivision (a) shall be eligible for apportionment purstant to Section 42238.5, for sehool distriets, and Section 2558, for county offriees of edtreation. Nothing in this section shall prevent a sehool district or county office of edturation from serving additional units of average daily attendanee greater than the ratio deseribed in subdivision (a), exeept that those additional units shall not be funded purstant to Section 42238.5 or Seetion 2558.
(e) The ealeulations performed for purposes of this seetion shall not inelude either of the following:
(1) The average daily attendanee generated by special edtueation pupils enrolled in special day classes on a full-time basis, of the teachers of those classes.
(2) The average daily attendanee or teachers in neeessary small sehools that are eligible to receive funding pursuant to Article 4 (eommeneing with Seetion 42280) of Chapter 7 of Part 24 of Đivision 3.
(d) The pupil-teacher ratio deseribed in subdivision (a) in a unified sehool district participating in the class size reduetion program purstant to Chapter 6.10 (commeneing with Section 52120) may, at the sehooldistriet's option, be ealeulated separately for kindergarten and grades 1 to 6 , inelusive, and for grades 7 to 12 , inelusive.
(e) The pupils-to-eertifieated-employee ratio deseribed in subdivision (a) may, in a chatter sehool, be caleulated by using a fixed pupils-to-eertifieated-employee ratio of 25 to one, or by being a ratio of less than 25 pupils per certifieated employee. All charter sehool pupits, regardless of age, shall be ineluded in pupil-to-eertifieated-employee ratio ealeulations.
(f) With respeet to a pupil who is enrolled for at least the minimum sehool day through elasses that inelude both a elassroom-based setting and at least one class offered through an enline program, a school distriet, county office of edtueation, or eharter sehool may demonstrate complianee with this seetion by
eertifying to the Superintendent that at least 85 pereent of the
