## ASSEMBLY BILL

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An act to amend Sections ~~89090.5 and 92630.9~~ of 89090, 89090.5, 92630, and 92630.9 of, and to add Sections 89090.3 and 92630.3 to, the Education Code, relating to public postsecondary education.

### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1222, as amended, Bonnie Lowenthal. California State University and University of California: alumni: disclosure.

**Existing**

(1) *Existing* law establishes the California State University, administered by the Trustees of the California State University, and the University of California, administered by the Regents of the University of California, as two of the segments of public postsecondary education in this state. Existing law establishes the Hastings College of the Law, under the governance of the Board of Directors of the Hastings College of the Law, within the University of California.

Existing law prescribes criteria for the disclosure of the names and addresses of alumni of the California State University, the University of California, and the Hastings College of the Law. Existing law requires that the names, addresses, and electronic mail addresses of alumni be disclosed only to provide those persons with informational materials

relating to the California State University, the University of California, and the Hastings College of the Law, and its programs and activities; to provide those persons, or the trustees, auxiliary organizations of the California State University, as defined, or the Regents of the University of California, the Board of Directors of the Hastings College of the Law, or the alumni associations with beneficial commercial opportunities; or to promote and support the educational mission of the California State University, the University of California, the trustees, the regents, the Board of Directors of the Hastings College of the Law, or the alumni associations.

Existing law authorizes this disclosure only if the trustees, auxiliary organizations, or the alumni associations, in the case of the California State University, or the regents, the board of directors, or the alumni associations, in the case of the University of California and the Hastings College of the Law, have a written agreement with a business, as defined, that maintains control over this data that requires the business to maintain the confidentiality of the names, addresses, and electronic mail addresses of the alumni, that requires that the university ~~retain~~ or the college *retain* the right to approve or reject any purpose for which the private information is to be used by the business and to review and approve the text of mailings sent to alumni, and that prohibits the business from using the information for any purposes other than those described, and the disclosure of alumni names, addresses, and electronic mail addresses does not include the names and addresses of alumni who have directed the trustees, the regents, the board of directors, or an alumni association or auxiliary organization, not to disclose their names, addresses, or electronic mail addresses.

Existing law requires the California State University, the University of California, and the Hastings College of the Law to make available to its alumni a specified form or an alternative notice, including specified information, in a mailing or in an Internet posting, as prescribed, before alumni names, addresses, and electronic mail addresses may be disclosed.

*This bill would require the form to be provided to alumni through a link on the homepage of the Internet Web site of the alumni association or in the alumni association's privacy policy.*

*The bill would also express the intent of the Legislature that, by July 1, 2014, the California State University and the University of California submit reports to the Legislature regarding compliance with these provisions.*

(2) *Under* existing law, these provisions are applicable to the University of California and the Hastings College of the Law only to the extent that the regents or the board of directors act, by resolution, to make them applicable.

Existing law specifies that these provisions are repealed as of January 1, 2011.

This bill would extend those repeal dates to January 1, 2016.

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

1     SECTION 1. Section 89090 of the Education Code is amended  
2     to read:

3     89090. (a) The trustees, alumni associations, and auxiliary  
4     organizations may distribute the names, addresses, and electronic  
5     mail addresses of alumni of the California State University to a  
6     business as described in subdivision (b), in order to accomplish  
7     any or all of the following:

8     (1) To provide those persons with informational materials  
9     relating to the university and its programs and activities.

10    (2) To provide those persons, the trustees, the alumni  
11    associations, and the auxiliary organizations with commercial  
12    opportunities that provide a benefit to those persons, or to the  
13    trustees, alumni associations, or auxiliary organizations.

14    (3) To promote and support the educational mission of the  
15    university, the trustees, the alumni associations, or the auxiliary  
16    organizations.

17    (b) The disclosures authorized in subdivision (a) shall be  
18    permitted only if all of the following requirements are met:

19    (1) (A) The trustees, the alumni associations, or the auxiliary  
20    organizations have a written agreement with a business, as defined  
21    in subdivision (a) of Section 1798.80 of the Civil Code, that  
22    maintains control over this data that requires the business to  
23    maintain the confidentiality of the names, addresses, and electronic  
24    mail addresses of the alumni, that requires that the California State  
25    University retain the right to approve or reject any purpose for  
26    which the private information is to be used by the business, and  
27    to review and approve the text of mailings sent to alumni pursuant

1 to this section, and that prohibits the business from using the  
2 information for any purposes other than those described in  
3 subdivision (a). The text of a mailing intended to be sent to alumni  
4 pursuant to this section shall not be approved by the trustees, the  
5 affected alumni association, or the affected auxiliary organization  
6 unless and until the mailing conspicuously identifies the university,  
7 the alumni association, or the auxiliary organization as associated  
8 with the business described in the mailing.

9 (B) If an affinity partner, as defined in Section 4054.6 of the  
10 Financial Code, sends any message to any electronic mail address  
11 obtained pursuant to this section, that message shall include at  
12 least both of the following:

13 (i) The identity of the sender of the message.

14 (ii) A cost-free means for the recipient to notify the sender not  
15 to electronically transmit any further message to the recipient.

16 (2) The trustees, an alumni association, or an auxiliary  
17 organization shall not disclose to, or share alumni nonpublic  
18 personal information with, a business, as defined in paragraph (1)  
19 unless the institution, association, or organization has clearly and  
20 conspicuously notified the alumnus, pursuant to subdivision (c),  
21 that the nonpublic personal information may be disclosed to the  
22 business and that the alumnus has not directed that the nonpublic  
23 personal information not be disclosed.

24 (3) The disclosure of alumni names, addresses, and electronic  
25 mail addresses does not include the names, addresses, and  
26 electronic mail addresses of alumni who, pursuant to subdivision  
27 (c) or in another manner, have directed the trustees, an alumni  
28 association, or an auxiliary organization not to disclose their names,  
29 addresses, or electronic mail addresses.

30 (4) No information regarding either of the following is disclosed:

31 (A) Any current students of the California State University.

32 (B) Any alumnus who, as a student at a campus of the California  
33 State University, indicated that, pursuant to the Family Educational  
34 Rights and Privacy Act, he or she did not wish his or her name,  
35 address, and electronic mail address to be disclosed.

36 (c) (1) The trustees, the affected alumni association, or the  
37 affected auxiliary organization shall satisfy the notice requirements  
38 of subdivision (b) if it uses the form set forth in paragraph (2). The  
39 form set forth in this subdivision or a form that complies with  
40 subparagraphs (A) to (J), inclusive, of this paragraph shall be

1 provided by the trustees, the alumni association, or the auxiliary  
2 organization to the alumnus as required in this subdivision, and  
3 shall describe the nature of the information the alumnus would  
4 receive should the alumnus choose not to opt out, so that the  
5 alumnus may make a decision and provide direction to the trustees,  
6 the alumni association, or the auxiliary organization regarding the  
7 sharing of his or her name, address, and electronic mail address:

8 (A) The form uses the title “IMPORTANT PRIVACY  
9 CHOICE” and the header, if applicable, as follows: “Restrict  
10 Information Sharing With Affinity Partners.”

11 (B) The titles and headers in the form are clearly and  
12 conspicuously displayed, and no text in the form is smaller than  
13 10-point type.

14 (C) The form is a separate document, except as provided by  
15 subparagraph (B) of paragraph (3).

16 (D) The choice or choices provided in the form are stated  
17 separately, and may be selected by checking a box.

18 (E) The form is designed to call attention to the nature and  
19 significance of the information in the document.

20 (F) The form presents information in clear and concise  
21 sentences, paragraphs, and sections.

22 (G) The form uses short explanatory sentences (an average of  
23 15 to 20 words) or bullet lists whenever possible.

24 (H) The form avoids multiple negatives, legal terminology, and  
25 highly technical terminology whenever possible.

26 (I) The form avoids explanations that are imprecise and readily  
27 subject to different interpretations.

28 (J) The form is not more than one page.

29 (2) The form reads as follows:

31 (3) (A) The trustees, the affected alumni association, or the  
32 affected auxiliary organization shall not be in violation of this  
33 subdivision solely because they include in the form one or more  
34 brief examples or explanations of the purpose or purposes for  
35 which, or the context within which, names, addresses, and  
36 electronic mail addresses will be shared, as long as those examples  
37 meet the clarity and readability standards set forth in paragraph  
38 (1).

39 (B) The form shall be provided to alumni in each of the  
40 following communications:

1 (i) The solicitation to students, upon their graduation, from the  
2 trustees or the alumni association, encouraging students to join the  
3 alumni association or to avail themselves of the services or benefits  
4 of the association, shall include the form.

5 (ii) The alumni association magazine or newsletter, or both,  
6 shall include the form on an annual or more frequent basis.

7 (iii) The *Internet* Web site for the alumni association shall  
8 include a link to the form, *which shall be located on either the*  
9 *homepage of the association's Internet Web site or in the*  
10 *association's privacy policy.*

11 (iv) A one-time mailing to all alumni on the university mailing  
12 list as of January 1, 2006.

13 (v) An annual electronic communication to those alumni for  
14 whom electronic mail addresses are available.

15 (4) The trustees, the affected alumni associations, or the affected  
16 auxiliary organizations shall provide at least two alternative  
17 cost-free means for alumni to communicate their privacy choices,  
18 such as calling a toll-free telephone number or using electronic  
19 means. The trustees, the alumni association, or the auxiliary  
20 organization shall clearly and conspicuously disclose in the form  
21 required by this subdivision the information necessary to direct  
22 the alumnus on how to communicate his or her choice, including  
23 the toll-free telephone or facsimile number or Web site address  
24 that may be used, if those means of communication are offered.

25 (5) (A) An alumnus may direct at any time that his or her name,  
26 address, and electronic mail address not be disclosed. The trustees,  
27 the affected alumni association, or the affected auxiliary  
28 organization shall comply with the direction of an alumnus  
29 concerning the sharing of his or her name, address, and electronic  
30 mail address within 45 days of receipt by the trustees, the alumni  
31 association, or the auxiliary organization. When an alumnus directs  
32 that his or her name, address, and electronic mail address not be  
33 disclosed, that direction is in effect until otherwise stated by the  
34 alumnus.

35 (B) Nothing in this subdivision shall prohibit the disclosure of  
36 the name, address, and electronic mail address of an alumnus as  
37 allowed by other applicable provisions of state law.

38 (6) The trustees, or the affected alumni association or the  
39 affected auxiliary organization, may provide a joint notice from  
40 the trustees or from one or more alumni associations, as identified

1 in the notice, so long as the notice is accurate with respect to the  
2 trustees and the alumni association or associations or auxiliary  
3 organization or organizations participating in the joint notice.

4 (d) As used in this section, “auxiliary organization” has the  
5 same meaning as is set forth in Section 89901.

6 (e) This section shall not be construed to authorize the release  
7 of any social security numbers.

10 *89090.3. It is the intent of the Legislature that, on or before*  
11 *July 1, 2014, the California State University provide a letter to*  
12 *the Assembly Committee on Judiciary and the Senate Committee*  
13 *on Judiciary containing all of the following information:*

14 (a) A survey of the affinity partnership agreements for each  
15 campus, including how many alumni have opted out of those  
16 agreements, and a description of the affinity partnership program.

17 (b) Whether alumni are receiving opt-out forms pursuant to  
18 paragraph (1) of subdivision (c) of Section 89090, and if so, a  
19 description of when the alumni receive those forms and the manner  
20 in which the alumni receive the forms.

(4) No information regarding either of the following is disclosed:

(A) Any current students of the University of California or the Hastings College of the Law.

(B) Any alumnus who, as a student of a campus of the University of California or the Hastings College of the Law, indicated that, pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, he or she did not wish his or her name, address, and electronic mail address to be disclosed.

(c) (1) The regents, the board of directors, or the affected alumni association shall satisfy the notice requirements of subdivision (b) if it uses the form set forth in paragraph (2). The form set forth in this subdivision or a form that complies with subparagraphs (A) to (J), inclusive, of this paragraph shall be provided by the regents, the board of directors, or the alumni association to the alumnus as required in this subdivision, and shall describe the nature of the information the alumnus would receive should the alumnus choose not to opt out, so that the alumnus may make a decision and provide direction to the regents and the alumni association regarding the sharing of his or her name, address, and electronic mail address:

(A) The form uses the title "IMPORTANT PRIVACY CHOICE" and the header, if applicable, as follows: "Restrict Information Sharing With Affinity Partners."

(B) The titles and headers in the form are clearly and conspicuously displayed, and no text in the form is smaller than 10-point type.
