~~An act to amend Section 44210 of the Education Code, relating to teacher credentialing. An act to add Chapter 17 (commencing with Section 26495) to Part 2 of Division 2 of Title 3 of the Government Code, relating to local government.~~

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1451, as amended, Ammiano. ~~Teacher credentialing. The Local Government Identification Act.~~

Existing law authorizes the Department of Motor Vehicles to issue an identification card to any person attesting to the true full name, correct age, and other identifying data as certified by the applicant for the identification card, and authorizes the department to refuse to issue an identification card under certain circumstances.

This bill would establish the Local Government Identification Act, which would authorize county governments to issue identification cards to persons who can provide proof of identity and proof of residency, as specified.

~~Existing law establishes the Commission on Teacher Credentialing that consists of 15 voting members, 14 of whom are appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. Existing law establishes the terms for members of the commission, and specifies that~~

the terms of appointed members expire on November 20 of the year of expiration of the applicable terms:

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 17 (commencing with Section 26495) is
2 added to Part 2 of Division 2 of Title 3 of the Government Code,

5 CHAPTER 17. LOCAL GOVERNMENT IDENTIFICATION ACT

7 26495. This act is known, and may be cited, as the Local
8 Government Identification Act.

9 26495.1. A county may, pursuant to this chapter, issue local
10 government identification cards to its residents, on a voluntary
11 basis.

12 26495.2. As used in this chapter, unless the context indicates
13 otherwise, the following terms have the following meanings:

- 14 (a) "Clerk" means the office of the county clerk.
- 15 (b) "County" means a county or a city and county.
- 16 (c) (1) "Local identification card" means an identification card
17 issued by the county that shall display, including, but not limited
18 to, the following information:

- 19 (A) The cardholder's name.
- 20 (B) The cardholder's photograph.
- 21 (C) The cardholder's date of birth.
- 22 (D) An expiration date.
- 23 (2) The local government identification card shall not identify
24 the cardholder's gender.

25 (d) "Resident" means a person who can demonstrate that he
26 or she has been present in the issuing county for at least 15
27 continuous days, and who can provide a proof of residency, as
28 provided in subdivision (c) of Section 26495.3.

29 26495.3. (a) To obtain an identification card, a resident shall
30 complete an application, provided by the county, which shall
31 require proof of identity and proof of residence within the county.

1 *Upon receipt and verification of the proof of identity, pursuant to*
2 *subdivision (b), and proof of residency, pursuant to subdivision*
3 *(c), the clerk shall issue an identification card to the applicant.*

4 *(b) To establish identity, the applicant shall present either of*
5 *the following:*

6 *(1) (A) One of the following documents, which shall contain*
7 *both the applicant's photograph and the applicant's date of birth:*

8 *(i) A United States or foreign passport.*

9 *(ii) A driver's license issued by any state in the United States.*

10 *(iii) A state identification card issued by any state in the United*
11 *States.*

12 *(iv) A United States Permanent Residency Card, otherwise*
13 *known as a green card.*

14 *(v) A consular identification card.*

15 *(vi) A photo identification card issued by another county to its*
16 *residents or nationals.*

17 *(B) Notwithstanding subparagraph (A), if the applicant is under*
18 *13 years of age, the applicant may alternatively present a certified*
19 *copy of a United States or foreign birth certificate.*

20 *(2) (A) Two of the following documents, at least one of which*
21 *shall display the applicant's photograph and date of birth:*

22 *(i) A national identification card with a photograph of the*
23 *applicant, the applicant's name, address, date of birth, and the*
24 *date the identification card expires.*

25 *(ii) A foreign driver's license.*

26 *(iii) A United States or foreign military identification card.*

27 *(iv) A current visa issued by a governmental agency.*

28 *(v) A United States Individual Taxpayer Identification Number*
29 *authorization letter.*

30 *(vi) An identification card issued by an educational institution,*
31 *including an elementary, middle, secondary, or postsecondary*
32 *school, in this state.*

33 *(vii) A certified copy of a United States or foreign birth*
34 *certificate.*

35 *(viii) A social security card.*

36 *(B) Notwithstanding subparagraph (A), if the applicant is under*
37 *13 years of age, the applicant may alternatively present an official*
38 *medical record or official school record to establish identity under*
39 *this section. One of the two forms of identification presented shall*
40 *display the applicant's date of birth.*

- 1 (c) (1) *To establish residency, each applicant shall present one*
2 *of the following items, which shall include both the applicant's*
3 *name and a residential address located within the county:*
- 4 (A) *A utility bill dated within the last 30 days.*
5 (B) *A written verification issued by a homeless shelter that*
6 *receives county funding confirming at least 15 days' residency*
7 *within the last 30 days.*
8 (C) *Written verification issued by a hospital, health clinic, or*
9 *social services agency that receives county funding confirming at*
10 *least 15 days' residency within the last 30 days.*
11 (D) *A local property tax statement or mortgage payment receipt*
12 *dated within the last 30 days.*
13 (E) *A bank account statement dated within the last 30 days.*
14 (F) *Proof of a minor currently enrolled in a public school within*
15 *the county.*
16 (G) *An employment pay stub dated within the last 30 days.*
17 (H) *A jury summons or court order issued by a state or federal*
18 *court dated within the last 30 days.*
19 (I) *An automobile, health, homeowner's, life, or renter's*
20 *insurance bill dated within the last 30 days.*
21 (J) *A marriage certificate, along with documents bearing the*
22 *name of the applicant's spouse.*
- 23 (2) *The board of supervisors may, by ordinance, provide that*
24 *an applicant that is under 13 years of age and cannot provide any*
25 *of the evidence set forth in subparagraph (A) of paragraph (1), a*
26 *parent or legal guardian may verify the applicant's residency, if*
27 *that parent or guardian would be eligible for a local identification*
28 *card.*
- 29 (d) *The board of supervisors may, by ordinance, authorize the*
30 *clerk to accept alternative forms of proof of identity, pursuant to*
31 *subdivision (b), or proof of residency, pursuant to subdivision (c),*
32 *if the alternate forms of proof of identity meet any of the following*
33 *conditions:*
- 34 (1) *The proof of identity is issued by a governmental entity.*
35 (2) *The proof of identity is issued by an entity that takes*
36 *reasonable steps to verify the identity or residence of the individual*
37 *to whom the item is issued.*
38 (3) *The proof of identity is of a type that is normally accepted*
39 *as proof of identity or proof of residency in the ordinary course*
40 *of business.*

1 (e) An application submitted on behalf of a minor shall be
2 completed by the minor's parent or legal guardian.

3 (f) (1) The clerk shall keep confidential the name and other
4 identifying information of persons applying for, and receiving,
5 local identification cards. The clerk shall not keep a record of the
6 applicant's residential address.

7 (2) The application shall include an option for the applicant to
8 select his or her privacy preferences.

9 26495.4. The board of supervisors may adopt rules and
10 regulations, consistent with this chapter, to implement, and, to
11 administer the implementation of, this chapter.

12 26495.5. The board of supervisors may impose a fee of not
13 more than fifteen dollars (\$15) per card for persons over 18 years
14 of age, and a fee of not more than five dollars (\$5) per card for
15 minors and seniors who present proof of age in a form to be
16 determined by the board. The fee shall not exceed administrative
17 costs reasonably associated with the production of the cards, and
18 the board shall provide for a reduced application fee or a waiver
19 of the application fee for low-income applicants who can provide
20 proof of income.

21 26495.6. (a) In a county that issues local government
22 identification cards, every agency, department, and office of the
23 county, and every city, and every agency, department, and office
24 of the city, shall accept a local identification card for proof of
25 identification or proof of residency, except where otherwise
26 provided by law.

27 (b) In a county that issues local government identification cards,
28 every city, redevelopment agency, school district, special district,
29 and any other local agency may accept a local identification card
30 for proof of identification or proof of residency, except where
31 otherwise provided by law.

32 26495.7. This chapter shall not be construed to replace or
33 supplant any other existing requirements for issuance of other
34 forms of identification in connection with any city, county, state,
35 or federal benefits and services.

38 ~~44210. (a) There is hereby established in the state government~~
39 ~~the Commission on Teacher Credentialing, to consist of 15 voting~~
40 ~~members, 14 of whom shall be appointed by the Governor with~~

1 the advice and consent of the Senate, as specified in paragraphs
2 (2) to (7), inclusive. The commission shall consist of the following
3 members:

4 (1) The Superintendent or his or her designee.

5 (2) Six practicing teachers from public elementary and secondary
6 schools in California.

7 (3) One person who is employed on the basis of a services
8 credential other than an administrative services credential.

9 (4) One member of a school district governing board.

10 (5) Four representatives of the public. None of these persons
11 shall have been employed by an elementary or secondary school
12 district in a position requiring certification, or shall have served
13 as a school district governing board member in the five-year period
14 immediately prior to his or her appointment to the commission.

15 (6) One school administrator in a public elementary or secondary
16 school in California.

17 (7) One faculty member from a college or university that grants
18 baccalaureate degrees.

19 (b) With the exception of the four representatives of the public
20 and the Superintendent, the appointment of a member shall
21 terminate if he or she is no longer a practicing teacher in a public
22 elementary or secondary school, a person who is employed on the
23 basis of a valid services credential, a school administrator, a faculty
24 member of a college or university that grants baccalaureate degrees,
25 or a school district governing board member, as may be the case,
26 in California.

27 (c) Not more than one member of the commission is to be
28 appointed from the same school district or college or university
29 campus.

30 (d) The term of each member appointed to the commission on
31 or prior to June 30, 1989, shall expire on July 1, 1989. It is the
32 intent of the Legislature that as of July 1, 1989, the Governor first
33 appoint to the commission, as feasible, members of the
34 Commission on Teacher Credentialing whose terms,
35 notwithstanding this section, would not have expired, to facilitate
36 the transition to a commission with a reduced membership.
37 Commencing July 1, 1989, four members shall be appointed to
38 the commission for terms of two years, five members for terms of
39 three years, and five members for terms of four years.

1 ~~(e) Each appointment pursuant to this section shall expire on~~
2 ~~December 1 of the year of expiration of the applicable term. All~~
