An act to amend Section 13711 of the Penal Code, relating to domestic violence.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2094, as introduced, Torrico. Domestic violence: restraining order.

Existing law requires that whenever a protection order with respect to domestic violence incidents is applied for or issued, it shall be the responsibility of the clerk of the superior court to distribute a pamphlet to the person who is to be protected by the order that includes the specified elements.

This bill would require the clerk to deliver the pamphlet to the person who is to be protected by the order.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes.  
State-mandated local program: no.

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 13711 of the Penal Code is amended to  
2 read:  
3 13711. Whenever a protection order with respect to domestic  
4 violence incidents, including orders issued pursuant to Section  
5 136.2 and restraining orders, is applied for or issued, it shall be  
6 the responsibility of the clerk of the superior court to ~~distribute~~

- 1 *deliver* a pamphlet to the person who is to be protected by the order  
2 that includes the following:
- 3 (a) Information as specified in *paragraph (9) of subdivision (i)*  
4 *(c)* of Section 13701.
  - 5 (b) Notice that it is the responsibility of the victim to request  
6 notification of an inmate's release.
  - 7 (c) Notice that the terms and conditions of the protection order  
8 remain enforceable, notwithstanding any acts of the parties, and  
9 may be changed only by order of the court.
  - 10 (d) Notice that the protection order is enforceable in any state,  
11 in a commonwealth, territory, or insular possession subject to the  
12 jurisdiction of the United States, or on a reservation, and general  
13 information about agencies in other jurisdictions that may be  
14 contacted regarding enforcement of a protective order issued by  
15 a court of this state.
