An act to amend Section 19576 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to horse racing.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2201, as introduced, Coto. Horse racing: audio or video recording.

Existing law prohibits a person from furnishing to another person, and from using, an audio or video recording of any quarter horse race occurring in this state for any commercial purpose without permission from the racing association conducting the meeting, the organization representing horsemen and horsewomen participating in the meeting, and the California Horse Racing Board.

This bill would make technical, nonsubstantive changes to those provisions.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 19576 of the Business and Professions
- 2 Code is amended to read:
- 3 19576. (a) No person may furnish an audio or video recording
- 4 of ~~any~~ a quarter horse race occurring in this state to any other
- 5 person either within or outside of the state for any commercial
- 6 purpose, including the use of the recording in any type of video
- 7 game, without first securing the consent of the racing association

3 (b) No person may use any audio or video recording of ~~any a~~
4 quarter horse race occurring in this state for any commercial
5 purpose without first securing the consent of the racing association

8 (c) Any person whose consent is required under this section
9 may file and maintain an action in superior court to obtain an
10 injunction against the furnishing or commercial use of a recording
11 of a quarter horse race in violation of this section.
