An act to add Sections 60905, 60905.1, 60905.2, and 60905.3 to the Education Code, relating to public school instruction. An act to add Section 60905 to the Education Code, relating to public school instruction.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2265, as amended, Salas. Pupil achievement: California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System.

Existing law requires the State Department of Education to contract for the development of proposals that will provide for the retention and analysis of longitudinal pupil achievement data on the STAR Program, English language development tests, and the high school exit examination, known as the California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System.

This bill would require the department to allocate specified funding, subject to funds being appropriated in the annual Budget Act, as part of a local data management support program, to local educational agencies and direct-funded charter schools that complete specified acts. Local educational agencies and direct-funded charter schools would be limited in the use of these funds for specified activities.

5 following:

6 (a) California’s multibillion dollar educational enterprise for
7 kindergarten and grades 1 to 12, inclusive, of California is held
8 accountable based on data received from local educational agencies.

9 (b) National and state educational reform efforts revolve around
10 using data at both the state and local levels to inform better
11 decisions.

12 (c) The feasibility study report developed pursuant to subdivision
13 (a) of Section 60900 found that poor quality data submitted by
14 local educational agencies is a high impact risk to the California
15 Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System.

16 (d) The California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System
17 can provide more accurate graduation and dropout rate information
18 if local educational agencies and direct-funded charter schools
19 provide quality data to the system through statewide pupil
20 identifiers.

15 (c) If funds appropriated in the annual Budget Act are

17 department shall prorate the rates specified in paragraphs (1) and
18 (2) of subdivision (a).

20 (d) The department shall allocate this funding annually to local
21 educational agencies and direct-funded charter schools that do all
22 of the following:

23 (1) Resolve anomalies related to the statewide pupil identifier
24 required by paragraph (5) of subdivision (e) of Section 60900
25 assigned to enrolled pupils in order to maintain a validity rate
26 specified by the Superintendent.

27 (2) Include the statewide pupil identifier on the transcript of
28 each pupil.

30 data management or information technology directors or personnel
31 in order to facilitate communication between the department and
32 the appropriate personnel of the local educational agency *or*
33 *direct-funded charter school.*
