LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SCR 68, as introduced, Strickland. Ronald Reagan Day.
This measure would recognize February 6, 2011, as Ronald Reagan Day.

- 1 WHEREAS, President Ronald Wilson Reagan, a man of humble
2 background, worked throughout his life serving freedom and
3 advancing the public good, having been employed as an entertainer,
4 union leader, corporate spokesman, Governor of California, and
5 President of the United States; and
6 WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan served with honor and distinction
7 for two terms as the 40th President of the United States of America;
8 the second of which he earned the confidence of three-fifths of the
9 electorate and was victorious in 49 of the 50 states in the general
10 election—a record unsurpassed in the history of American
11 presidential elections; and
12 WHEREAS, In 1981, when Ronald Reagan was inaugurated
13 President, he inherited a disillusioned nation shackled by rampant
14 inflation and high unemployment; and
15 WHEREAS, President Reagan's commitment to the nation's
16 children helped lower crime and drug use in our neighborhoods;

1 WHEREAS, President Reagan’s commitment to our Armed
2 Forces contributed to the restoration of pride in America, her
3 values, and those cherished by the free world, and prepared
4 America’s Armed Forces to meet 21st century challenges; and

5 WHEREAS, President Reagan’s vision of “peace through
6 strength” led to the end of the Cold War; and

7 WHEREAS, February 6, 2011, will be the 100th anniversary
8 of Ronald Reagan’s birth, and the seventh since his passing; now,
9 therefore, be it

10 *Resolved by the Senate of the State of California, the Assembly*
11 *thereof concurring,* That the Legislature takes great pride in
12 honoring Ronald Reagan for his many contributions to our country
13 and in celebrating his life; and be it further

14 *Resolved,* That the Legislature recognizes February 6, 2011, as
15 Ronald Reagan Day; and be it further

16 *Resolved,* That the Secretary of the Senate transmit copies of
17 this resolution to the author for appropriate distribution.
