An act to amend Section 38225 of the Vehicle Code, relating to off-highway vehicles.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 980, as introduced, Hollingsworth. Off-highway motor vehicle recreation: fees.

Existing law generally requires a service fee of \$7 for the issuance or renewal of identification of off-highway motor vehicles subject to identification. In addition, existing law imposes a special fee of \$33 that is required to be paid at the time of payment of the service fee and that is to be deposited in the Off-Highway Vehicle Trust Fund. Existing law provides that these provisions shall remain in effect until January 1, 2018, and as of that date are repealed.

This bill would make technical, nonsubstantive changes to this law.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 38225 of the Vehicle Code is amended
2 to read:

3 38225. (a) A service fee of seven dollars (\$7) shall be paid to
4 the department for the issuance or renewal of identification of
5 off-highway motor vehicles subject to identification, except as
6 expressly exempted under this division.

7 (b) In addition to the service fee required by subdivision (a), a
8 special fee of thirty-three dollars (\$33) shall be paid at the time of

1 payment of the service fee for the issuance or renewal of an
2 identification plate or device.

3 (c) All money transferred pursuant to Section 8352.6 of the
4 Revenue and Taxation Code, all fees received by the department
5 pursuant to subdivision (b), and all day use, overnight use, or
6 annual or biennial use fees for state vehicular recreation areas
7 received by the Department of Parks and Recreation shall be
8 deposited in the Off-Highway Vehicle Trust Fund, which is hereby
9 created. There shall be a separate reporting of special fee revenues
10 by vehicle type, including four-wheeled vehicles, all-terrain
11 vehicles, motorcycles, and snowmobiles. All money shall be
12 deposited in the fund, and, upon appropriation by the Legislature,
13 shall be allocated according to Section 5090.61 of the Public
14 Resources Code.

15 (d) ~~Any~~ All money temporarily transferred by the Legislature
16 from the Off-Highway Vehicle Trust Fund to the General Fund
17 shall be reimbursed, without interest, by the Legislature within
18 two fiscal years of the transfer.

19 (e) This section shall remain in effect only until January 1, 2018,
20 and as of that date is repealed, unless a later enacted statute, that
21 is enacted before January 1, 2018, deletes or extends that date.
22 ~~Any~~ All unencumbered funds remaining in the Off-Highway
23 Vehicle Trust Fund on January 1, 2018, shall be transferred to the
24 General Fund.
