Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 33—Relative to the Officer Richard T. Steed Memorial Highway.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

ACR 33, as amended, Harkey. Officer Richard T. Steed Memorial Highway.

This measure would designate a specified portion of State Highway Route 5 in the City of San Clemente as the Officer Richard T. Steed Memorial Highway. This measure would also request the Department of Transportation to determine the cost of appropriate signs showing this special designation and, upon receiving donations from nonstate sources covering those costs, to erect those signs.

Fiscal committee: yes.

1 WHEREAS, Richard (Rick) Thomas Steed was born on
2 December 27, 1947, to Henry and Martha Steed, and grew up in
3 Alexandria, Virginia with his brother Hank and sister Donna; and
4 WHEREAS, During the summers of 1964 to 1967, he managed
5 a community pool in Washington, D.C.; and
6 WHEREAS, After completing high school Rick enlisted in the
7 United States Marine Corps, where he served for eight years and
8 rose to the rank of Staff Sergeant. During his service Rick spent

1 one tour of duty in Vietnam as a radio technician in the Recon
2 Platoon, and also served in Okinawa. Rick was awarded a Navy
3 Commendation Medal, a Good Service Medal, and a Combat
4 Action Ribbon. He also earned his jump wings; and

5 WHEREAS, While still on active duty Rick became interested
6 in law enforcement and became a reserve police officer with the
7 San Clemente Police Department in July 1975; and

8 WHEREAS, After receiving his associate of arts degree in
9 criminal justice from Saddleback Community College, Rick was
10 hired as a full-time police officer with the San Clemente Police
11 Department on June 6, 1977. Officer Steed attended the Police
12 Academy at Los Medanos College in Pittsburgh, California, where
13 he was elected class president; and

14 WHEREAS, Always quick with a smile or a joke, Rick was
15 very popular with everyone from his fellow officers to the citizens
16 he met on the job. Despite his sense of humor, Rick took his
17 position very seriously. He was a very quick learner, and was
18 described by a supervisor as a man who took pride in everything
19 he did; and

20 WHEREAS, On his final patrol shift, on November 29, 1978,
21 Officer Steed answered a call for medical aid in an adjacent beat.
22 Officer Steed announced his arrival to the dispatcher and indicated
23 that he saw a subject approaching from behind his vehicle. As he
24 exited the car and turned toward the subject, Officer Steed was
25 immediately, and without provocation, shot twice with a .38 caliber
26 handgun, and died from those injuries; and

27 WHEREAS, A massive manhunt involving multiple law
28 enforcement agencies resulted in apprehending the suspect and
29 retrieving the murder weapon. The suspect was incarcerated in a
30 state mental hospital; and

31 WHEREAS, Officer Steed is the only San Clemente police
32 officer to die in the line of duty; and

33 WHEREAS, Officer Steed was enshrined on Honor Rolls in the
34 Santa Ana Courthouse, Sacramento, and Washington, D.C., and
35 named in the Honor Roll and Officer Down Memorial Internet
36 Web sites, and on memorial bricks in the Vietnam section of the
37 Saddleback College Veterans Memorial and at the Marine Corps
38 Museum in Quantico, Virginia. Additionally, a 64-acre park and
39 sports complex was named the Richard T. Steed Memorial Park,

1 and a plaque prominently displayed at Park Semper Fi near the
2 San Clemente Pier; and

3 WHEREAS, Officer Steed was survived by his wife Kathy; and

4 WHEREAS, In recognition of Officer Steed's great
5 contributions, service, and sacrifice to the City of San Clemente,
6 it would be a fitting tribute to designate a portion of State Highway
7 Route 5 in the City of San Clemente as the Officer Richard T.
8 Steed Memorial Highway; now, therefore, be it

9 *Resolved by the Assembly of the State of California, the Senate*
10 *thereof concurring*, That the Legislature hereby designates the
11 portion of State Highway Route 5 between the ~~San Louis Avenida~~
12 *San Luis Rey* exit and the Camino De Estrella exit in the City of
13 San Clemente as the Officer Richard T. Steed Memorial Highway;
14 and be it further

15 *Resolved*, That the Department of Transportation is requested
16 to determine the cost of appropriate signs consistent with the
17 signing requirements for the state highway system showing this
18 special designation and, upon receiving donations from nonstate
19 sources sufficient to cover the cost, to erect those signs; and be it
20 further

21 *Resolved*, That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly transmit copies
22 of this resolution to the Department of Transportation and to the
23 author for appropriate distribution.
