LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AJR 23, as amended, John A. Pérez. Economic development.

This bill would urge the United States Patent and Trademark Office to place a satellite office in California.

1 WHEREAS, California is at the forefront of the innovation
2 economy; and

3 WHEREAS, Northern California is the birthplace of
4 biotechnology, inventors and leaders in high technology, and the
5 burgeoning field of green technology; and

6 WHEREAS, Central California is home to much of our nation's
7 food supply; and

8 WHEREAS, Southern California is home to pioneers and leaders
9 of the entertainment industry, biomedical devices, and the
10 aerospace industry; and

11 WHEREAS, California entrepreneurs and companies continue
12 to innovate and expand; and

13 WHEREAS, In 2010, California received 30,080 patents,
14 representing 25 percent of all patents granted in the United States
15 and more than four times the number of any other state; and

16 WHEREAS, California has many of the top-ranked universities
17 in the country for engineering, science, and the law that produce
18 the educated workforce necessary to staff a satellite office of the
19 United States Patent and Trademark Office; and

20 WHEREAS, Many of the highest ranking law firms in
21 intellectual property and patent law all have offices in California;
22 and

23 WHEREAS, The landscape of California is incredibly diverse;
24 and

25 WHEREAS, California is the transportation hub of the west
26 coast with 11 ports, 29 commercial airports, 170 commuter trains,
27 38 intercity trains, and 16,662.16 miles of state highway; and

28 WHEREAS, Most of the foreign patent filings come from
29 countries in Asia, and California's proximity to Asia is a key reason
30 our major cities have well-established business networks within
31 Asia; and, therefore, be it

32 *Resolved by the Assembly and the Senate of the State of*
33 *California, jointly, That the Legislature of California stands*
34 *committed to fostering the economic and business environment*
35 *necessary to continue promoting the innovation economy in our*
36 *state and urges the United States Patent and Trademark Office to*
37 *place a satellite office in California; and be it further*
