An act to add Section 99155 to the Education Code, relating to postsecondary education.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 176, as introduced, Lara. Standardized testing: valid identification.

Existing law imposes various requirements on a test sponsor or test agency, as defined, with respect to the administration of standardized tests for purposes of postsecondary education.

Existing law provides that a test sponsor that intentionally violates these provisions is liable for a civil penalty not to exceed \$750 for each violation.

This bill would require a test sponsor to accept a university transcript and university identification issued within the last 5 years as a valid form of identification for purposes of admitting a test subject to take a standardized test administered by the sponsor. A violation of this requirement would subject a test sponsor to the above civil penalty.

- 5 administered by the sponsor other than that specified in subdivision
