An act to add Section 34251 to the Health and Safety Code, relating to transitional housing.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 264, as introduced, Hagman. Transitional housing.

Under existing law, in each city and county there is a public agency known as the housing authority of the city or county.

This bill would require operators of transitional housing to notify the city or county and residents within 300 feet of the property when a transitional housing facility will be established so that the city or county and residents have specified knowledge about the transitional housing facility.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 34251 is added to the Health and Safety
2 Code, to read:
3 34251. (a) "Transitional housing" as used in this section has
4 the same meaning as that term is defined in subdivision (i) of
5 Section 50801.
6 (b) Any operator of transitional housing shall notify the city or
7 county, as the case may be, in which it will be located and residents
8 within 300 feet of the property when a transitional housing facility

- 1 is being established so that the city or county and the residents will
2 have knowledge of the following:
- 3 (1) Where the transitional housing will be located.
 - 4 (2) The purpose of the transitional housing facility and what
5 segment of the population it will serve.
 - 6 (3) The name of the transitional housing operator with a point
7 of contact.
 - 8 (4) The state agency that will be responsible for oversight.
- 9 (c) The purpose of this section is to allow the residents to work
10 problems out directly with the transitional housing operator and
11 the state agency that regulates the transitional housing facility.
