An act to amend Section 152 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to public health.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 673, as introduced, John A. Pérez. Office of Multicultural Health: LGBT communities.

Existing law establishes the Office of Multicultural Health within the State Department of Public Health. Existing law requires the office to perform various duties on behalf of the State Department of Public Health and the State Department of Health Care Services relating to the state's racial and ethnic communities.

This bill would require the office to also perform those duties with respect to the state's lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender communities.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 152 of the Health and Safety Code is

- 3 152. (a) The office shall do all of the following on behalf of
- 4 the State Department of Health Care Services and the State
- 5 Department of Public Health:

- 1 (1) Perform strategic planning within these departments to
2 develop departmentwide plans for implementation of goals and
3 objectives to close the gaps in health status and access to care
4 among the state's diverse racial and ethnic communities *and the*
5 *lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) communities*.
- 6 (2) Conduct departmental policy analysis on specific issues
7 related to multicultural health.
- 8 (3) Coordinate pilot projects and planning projects funded by
9 the state that are related to improving the effectiveness of services
10 to ethnic and racial communities *and the LGBT communities*.
- 11 (4) Identify the unnecessary duplication of services and future
12 service needs.
- 13 (5) Communicate and disseminate information and perform a
14 liaison function within the departments and to providers of health,
15 social, educational, and support services to racial and ethnic
16 communities *and the LGBT communities*. The office shall consult
17 regularly with representatives from diverse racial and ethnic
18 communities *and the LGBT communities*, including health
19 providers, advocates, and consumers.
- 20 (6) Perform internal staff training, an internal assessment of
21 cultural competency, and training of health care professionals to
22 ensure more linguistically and culturally competent care.
- 23 (7) Serve as a resource for ensuring that programs keep data
24 and information regarding ethnic and racial health ~~statistics,~~
25 *statistics and information based on sexual orientation and gender*
26 *identity*, strategies and programs that address multicultural health
27 issues, including, but not limited to, infant mortality, cancer,
28 cardiovascular disease, diabetes, human immunodeficiency virus
29 (HIV), acquired-immune deficiency *immunodeficiency* syndrome
30 (AIDS), child and adult immunization, asthma, unintentional and
31 intentional injury, and obesity, as well as issues that impact the
32 health of racial and ethnic communities, including substance abuse,
33 mental health, housing, teenage pregnancy, environmental
34 disparities, immigrant and migrant health, and health insurance
35 and delivery systems.
- 36 (8) Encourage innovative responses by public and private entities
37 that are attempting to address multicultural health issues.
- 38 (9) Provide technical assistance to counties, other public entities,
39 and private entities seeking to obtain funds for initiatives in

- 1 multicultural health, including identification of funding sources
- 2 and assistance with writing grants.
- 3 (b) Notwithstanding Section ~~7550.5~~ *10231.5* of the Government
- 4 Code, the office shall biennially prepare and submit a report to the
- 5 Legislature on the status of the activities required by this chapter.

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
