An act to amend Section 21628.2 of the Business and Professions Code, to amend Sections 17000, 26600, 26610, 26615, 26805, 26820, 26840, 26845, 26850, 26865, 26890, 26905, 26955, 26960, 26965, 27050, 27060, 27065, 27130, 27400, 27410, 27415, 27540, 27560, 27565, 27590, 27600, 27610, 27615, 27655, 27660, 27665, 27730, 27860, 27875, 27880, 27920, 28000, 28060, 28100, 28160, 28170, 28180, 28210, 28215, 28220, 28230, 28240, 28245, 28400, 28410, 28415, 30105, 30150, 30160, 30165, 31705, 31715, 31720, 31735, 33850, 33860, 33865, 34355, 34365, and 34370 of, to amend and repeal Sections 27110, 27710, 27870, 27915, 27965, 28165, 31775, 31795, and 33890 of, to amend, repeal, and add Section 11106 of, and to add Section 27966 to, the Penal Code, relating to firearms.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 809, as amended, Feuer. Firearms.

Existing law generally regulates the transfer of firearms and provides for retaining specified information regarding firearm transfers by the Department of Justice. Existing law establishes different requirements regarding reportable information for handguns and firearms that are not handguns. Under existing law, the Department of Justice requires firearms dealers to keep a register or record of electronic or telephonic transfers of information pertaining to firearms transactions, as specified.

Existing law exempts from these requirements certain transactions involving firearms that are not handguns.

This bill would conform those provisions so that the transfers and information reporting and retention requirements for handguns and firearms other than handguns are the same. This bill would provide that those exemptions become inoperative on January 1, 2013.

Existing law, subject to specified exceptions, prohibits peace officers, Department of Justice employees, and the Attorney General from retaining or compiling certain information relating to transactions regarding firearms that are not handguns, as specified. A violation of these provisions is a misdemeanor.

This bill would provide that those provisions are repealed on January 1, 2013, and thereafter would require those peace officers to retain and compile information regarding firearms that are not handguns, as specified.

Existing law requires a personal handgun importer to report certain information relative to bringing a handgun into the state, as specified. Violation of these provisions is a misdemeanor.

This bill would, commencing January 1, 2013, apply these reporting requirements instead to a “personal firearm importer,” as defined, and would expand the reporting requirements to apply to the importation of firearms that are not handguns.

By expanding these provisions, the violation of which is a crime, this bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

The bill would make additional conforming changes and would make additional technical, nonsubstantive changes.

The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that no reimbursement is required by this act for a specified reason.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 21628.2 of the Business and Professions
- 2 Code, as amended by Section 17 of Chapter 178 of the Statutes of
- 3 2010, is amended to read:

1 21628.2. (a) For purposes of this section, the “department”
2 shall mean the Department of Justice.

3 (b) Every secondhand dealer described in Section 21626 shall,
4 in a format prescribed by the department, and on the day of the
5 transaction, electronically report to the department each firearm
6 purchased, taken in trade, taken in pawn, accepted for sale on
7 consignment, or accepted for auctioning. The secondhand dealer
8 shall retain a copy of the report submitted to the department and
9 make it available for inspection by the department, any peace
10 officer, or any local law enforcement employee who is authorized
11 by Article 1 (commencing with Section 26700) and Article 2
12 (commencing with Section 26800) of Chapter 2 of Division 6 of
13 Title 4 of Part 6 of the Penal Code to inspect a firearms transaction
14 record.

15 (c) The department may retain secondhand dealer reports to
16 determine whether a firearm taken in by a secondhand dealer has
17 been reported lost or stolen. If the department’s records indicate
18 that the firearm is lost or stolen, the department shall notify the
19 law enforcement agency that entered the information in the
20 department’s records and a law enforcement agency with
21 jurisdiction over the secondhand dealer’s business location about
22 the status of the firearm. The Dealers’ Record of Sale shall be
23 retained by the department pursuant to Section 11106 of the Penal
24 Code.

25 (d) All information in the secondhand dealer report of each
26 firearm described in subdivision (a) shall be electronically provided
27 by the department to the secure mailbox of the local law
28 enforcement agency described in Section 21630 within one working
29 day of receipt by the department.

30 SEC. 2. Section 11106 of the Penal Code, as amended by
31 Section 89 of Chapter 178 of the Statutes of 2010, is amended to
32 read:

33 11106. (a) In order to assist in the investigation of crime, the
34 prosecution of civil actions by city attorneys pursuant to paragraph
35 (3) of subdivision (c), the arrest and prosecution of criminals, and
36 the recovery of lost, stolen, or found property, the Attorney General
37 shall keep and properly file a complete record of all copies of
38 fingerprints, copies of licenses to carry firearms issued pursuant
39 to Section 26150, 26155, 26170, or 26215, information reported
40 to the Department of Justice pursuant to Section 26225, dealers’

1 records of sales of firearms, reports provided pursuant to Article
2 1 (commencing with Section 27500) of Chapter 4 of Division 6
3 of Title 4 of Part 6, or pursuant to any provision listed in
4 subdivision (a) of Section 16585, forms provided pursuant to
5 Section 12084, as that section read prior to being repealed, reports
6 provided pursuant to Article 1 (commencing with Section 26700)
7 and Article 2 (commencing with Section 26800) of Chapter 2 of
8 Division 6 of Title 4 of Part 6, that are not dealers' records of sales
9 of firearms, and reports of stolen, lost, found, pledged, or pawned
10 property in any city or county of this state, and shall, upon proper
11 application therefor, furnish this information to the officers referred
12 to in Section 11105.

13 (b) (1) Except as provided in subdivision (d), the Attorney
14 General shall not retain or compile any information from reports
15 filed pursuant to any provision listed in subdivision (c) of Section
16 16585 for firearms that are not handguns, from forms submitted
17 pursuant to Section 12084, as that section read prior to being
18 repealed, for firearms that are not handguns, or from dealers'
19 records of sales for firearms that are not handguns. All copies of
20 the forms submitted, or any information received in electronic
21 form, pursuant to Section 12084, as that section read prior to being
22 repealed, for firearms that are not handguns, or of the dealers'
23 records of sales for firearms that are not handguns shall be
24 destroyed within five days of the clearance by the Attorney
25 General, unless the purchaser or transferor is ineligible to take
26 possession of the firearm. All copies of the reports filed, or any
27 information received in electronic form, pursuant to any provision
28 listed in subdivision (c) of Section 16585 for firearms that are not
29 handguns shall be destroyed within five days of the receipt by the
30 Attorney General, unless retention is necessary for use in a criminal
31 prosecution.

32 (2) A peace officer, the Attorney General, a Department of
33 Justice employee designated by the Attorney General, or any
34 authorized local law enforcement employee shall not retain or
35 compile any information from a firearm transaction record, as
36 defined in Section 16550, for firearms that are not handguns unless
37 retention or compilation is necessary for use in a criminal
38 prosecution or in a proceeding to revoke a license issued pursuant
39 to Article 1 (commencing with Section 26700) and Article 2

(commencing with Section 26800) of Chapter 2 of Division 6 of Title 4 of Part 6.

(3) A violation of this subdivision is a misdemeanor.

(c) (1) The Attorney General shall permanently keep and properly file and maintain all information reported to the Department of Justice pursuant to the following provisions as to handguns and maintain a registry thereof:

(A) Article 1 (commencing with Section 26700) and Article 2 (commencing with Section 26800) of Chapter 2 of Division 6 of Title 4 of Part 6.

(B) Article 1 (commencing with Section 27500) of Chapter 4 of Division 6 of Title 4 of Part 6.

(C) Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 28050) of Division 6 of Title 4 of Part 6.

(D) Any provision listed in subdivision (a) of Section 16585.

(E) Former Section 12084.

(F) Any other law.

(2) The registry shall consist of all of the following:

(A) The name, address, identification of, place of birth (state or country), complete telephone number, occupation, sex, description, and all legal names and aliases ever used by the owner or person being loaned the particular firearm as listed on the information provided to the department on the Dealers' Record of Sale, the Law Enforcement Firearms Transfer (LEFT), as defined in former Section 12084, or reports made to the department pursuant to any provision listed in subdivision (a) of Section 16585 or any other law.

(B) The name and address of, and other information about, any person (whether a dealer or a private party) from whom the owner acquired or the person being loaned the particular firearm and when the firearm was acquired or loaned as listed on the information provided to the department on the Dealers' Record of Sale, the LEFT, or reports made to the department pursuant to any provision listed in subdivision (a) of Section 16585 or any other law.

(C) Any waiting period exemption applicable to the transaction which resulted in the owner of or the person being loaned the particular firearm acquiring or being loaned that firearm.

(D) The manufacturer's name if stamped on the firearm, model name or number if stamped on the firearm, and, if applicable, the

1 serial number, other number (if more than one serial number is
2 stamped on the firearm), caliber, type of firearm, if the firearm is
3 new or used, barrel length, and color of the firearm, or, if the
4 firearm is not a handgun and does not have a serial number or any
5 identification number or mark assigned to it, that shall be noted.

6 (3) Information in the registry referred to in this subdivision
7 shall, upon proper application therefor, be furnished to the officers
8 referred to in Section 11105, to a city attorney prosecuting a civil
9 action, solely for use in prosecuting that civil action and not for
10 any other purpose, or to the person listed in the registry as the
11 owner or person who is listed as being loaned the particular firearm.

12 (4) If any person is listed in the registry as the owner of a firearm
13 through a Dealers' Record of Sale prior to 1979, and the person
14 listed in the registry requests by letter that the Attorney General

17 form, the Attorney General shall do so within three working days

19 and as soon as practicable, notify the person requesting electronic

23 of subdivision (b) of Section 11105 may disseminate the name of
24 the subject of the record, the number of the firearms listed in the
25 record, and the description of any firearm, including the make,
26 model, and caliber, from the record relating to any firearm's sale,
27 transfer, registration, or license record, or any information reported
28 to the Department of Justice pursuant to Section 26225, Article 1
29 (commencing with Section 26700) and Article 2 (commencing
30 with Section 26800) of Chapter 2 of Division 6 of Title 4 of Part
31 6, (A) Article 1 (commencing with Section 27500) of Chapter 4
32 of Division 6 of Title 4 of Part 6, (B) Chapter 5 (commencing with
33 Section 28050) of Division 6 of Title 4 of Part 6, (C) Article 2
34 (commencing with Section 28150) of Chapter 6 of Division 6 of
35 Title 4 of Part 6, (D) Article 5 (commencing with Section 30900)
36 of Chapter 2 of Division 10 of Title 4 of Part 6, (E) Chapter 2
37 (commencing with Section 33850) of Division 11 of Title 4 of Part
38 6, or (F) any provision listed in subdivision (a) of Section 16585,
39 if the following conditions are met:

1 (A) The subject of the record has been arraigned for a crime in
2 which the victim is a person described in subdivisions (a) to (f),
3 inclusive, of Section 6211 of the Family Code and is being
4 prosecuted or is serving a sentence for the crime, or the subject of
5 the record is the subject of an emergency protective order, a
6 temporary restraining order, or an order after hearing, which is in
7 effect and has been issued by a family court under the Domestic
8 Violence Protection Act set forth in Division 10 (commencing
9 with Section 6200) of the Family Code.

10 (B) The information is disseminated only to the victim of the
11 crime or to the person who has obtained the emergency protective
12 order, the temporary restraining order, or the order after hearing
13 issued by the family court.

14 (C) Whenever a law enforcement officer disseminates the
15 information authorized by this subdivision, that officer or another
16 officer assigned to the case shall immediately provide the victim
17 of the crime with a "Victims of Domestic Violence" card, as
18 specified in subparagraph (H) of paragraph (9) of subdivision (c)
19 of Section 13701.

20 (2) The victim or person to whom information is disseminated
21 pursuant to this subdivision may disclose it as he or she deems
22 necessary to protect himself or herself or another person from
23 bodily harm by the person who is the subject of the record.

24 (e) This section shall remain in effect only until January 1, 2013,
25 and as of that date is repealed, unless a later enacted statute, that
26 is enacted before January 1, 2013, deletes or extends that date.

27 SEC. 2.5. Section 11106 is added to the Penal Code, to read:

28 11106. (a) In order to assist in the investigation of crime, the
29 prosecution of civil actions by city attorneys pursuant to paragraph
30 (3) of subdivision (c), the arrest and prosecution of criminals, and
31 the recovery of lost, stolen, or found property, the Attorney General
32 shall keep and properly file a complete record of all copies of

27 information provided to the department on the Dealers' Record of

30 pursuant to any provision listed in subdivision (a) of Section 16585
31 or any other law.

32 (B) The name and address of, and other information about, any
33 person (whether a dealer or a private party) from whom the owner

36 information provided to the department on the Dealers' Record of
37 Sale, the LEFT, or reports made to the department pursuant to any

(A) The subject of the record has been arraigned for a crime in which the victim is a person described in subdivisions (a) to (f), inclusive, of Section 6211 of the Family Code and is being prosecuted or is serving a sentence for the crime, or the subject of the record is the subject of an emergency protective order, a temporary restraining order, or an order after hearing, which is in effect and has been issued by a family court under the Domestic Violence Protection Act set forth in Division 10 (commencing with Section 6200) of the Family Code.

(B) The information is disseminated only to the victim of the crime or to the person who has obtained the emergency protective order, the temporary restraining order, or the order after hearing issued by the family court.

(C) Whenever a law enforcement officer disseminates the information authorized by this subdivision, that officer or another officer assigned to the case shall immediately provide the victim of the crime with a "Victims of Domestic Violence" card, as specified in subparagraph (H) of paragraph (9) of subdivision (c) of Section 13701.

(2) The victim or person to whom information is disseminated pursuant to this subdivision may disclose it as he or she deems necessary to protect himself or herself or another person from bodily harm by the person who is the subject of the record.

(d) This section shall become operative January 1, 2013.

SEC. 3. Section 17000 of the Penal Code is amended to read:

17000. (a) As used in this part, until January 1, 2013, any reference to the term "personal firearm importer" shall be deemed to mean "personal handgun importer" and, on and after January 1, 2013, any reference to the term "personal handgun importer" shall be deemed to mean "personal firearm importer." A "personal handgun importer," until January 1, 2013, and commencing January 1, 2013, a "personal firearm importer" means an individual who meets all of the following criteria:

(1) The individual is not a person licensed pursuant to Article 1 (commencing with Section 26700) and Article 2 (commencing with Section 26800) of Chapter 2 of Division 6 of Title 4.

1 (2) The individual is not a licensed manufacturer of firearms
2 pursuant to Chapter 44 (commencing with Section 921) of Title
3 18 of the United States Code.

4 (3) The individual is not a licensed importer of firearms pursuant
5 to Chapter 44 (commencing with Section 921) of Title 18 of the
6 United States Code and the regulations issued pursuant thereto.

7 (4) The individual is the owner of a firearm.

8 (5) The individual acquired that firearm outside of California.

9 (6) The individual moved into this state on or after January 1,
10 1998, in the case of a handgun, or in the case of a firearm that is
11 not a handgun, on or after January 1, 2013, as a resident of this
12 state.

13 (7) The individual intends to possess that handgun within this
14 state on or after January 1, 1998, or in the case of a firearm that is
15 not a handgun, he or she intends to possess that firearm within this
16 state on or after January 1, 2013.

17 (8) The firearm was not delivered to the individual by a person
18 licensed pursuant to Article 1 (commencing with Section 26700)
19 and Article 2 (commencing with Section 26800) of Chapter 2 of
20 Division 6 of Title 4, who delivered that firearm following the
21 procedures set forth in Section 27540 and Article 1 (commencing
22 with Section 26700) and Article 2 (commencing with Section
23 26800) of Chapter 2 of Division 6 of Title 4.

24 (9) The individual, while a resident of this state, had not
25 previously reported ownership of that firearm to the Department
26 of Justice in a manner prescribed by the department that included
27 information concerning the individual and a description of the
28 firearm.

29 (10) The firearm is not a firearm that is prohibited by any
30 provision listed in Section 16590.

31 (11) The firearm is not an assault weapon.

32 (12) The firearm is not a machinegun.

33 (13) The person is 18 years of age or older.

34 (b) For purposes of paragraph (6) of subdivision (a):

35 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), residency shall be
36 determined in the same manner as is the case for establishing
37 residency pursuant to Section 12505 of the Vehicle Code.

38 (2) In the case of a member of the Armed Forces of the United
39 States, residency shall be deemed to be established when the
40 individual was discharged from active service in this state.

1 SEC. 4. Section 26600 of the Penal Code is amended to read:
2 26600. (a) Section 26500 does not apply to any sale, delivery,
3 or transfer of firearms made to an authorized law enforcement
4 representative of any city, county, city and county, or state, or of
5 the federal government, for exclusive use by that governmental
6 agency if, prior to the sale, delivery, or transfer of these firearms,
7 written authorization from the head of the agency authorizing the
8 transaction is presented to the person from whom the purchase,
9 delivery, or transfer is being made.

10 (b) Proper written authorization is defined as verifiable written
11 certification from the head of the agency by which the purchaser
12 or transferee is employed, identifying the employee as an individual
13 authorized to conduct the transaction, and authorizing the
14 transaction for the exclusive use of the agency by which that person
15 is employed.

16 (c) Within 10 days of the date a handgun, and commencing
17 January 1, 2013, any firearm, is acquired by the agency, a record
18 of the same shall be entered as an institutional weapon into the
19 Automated Firearms System (AFS) via the California Law
20 Enforcement Telecommunications System (CLETS) by the law
21 enforcement or state agency. Any agency without access to AFS
22 shall arrange with the sheriff of the county in which the agency is

25 26610. (a) Section 26500 does not apply to the sale, delivery,
26 or transfer of a firearm by a law enforcement agency to a peace
27 officer pursuant to Section 10334 of the Public Contract Code.

28 (b) Within 10 days of the date that a handgun, and commencing
29 January 1, 2013, any firearm, is sold, delivered, or transferred
30 pursuant to Section 10334 of the Public Contract Code to that
31 peace officer, the name of the officer and the make, model, serial
32 number, and other identifying characteristics of the firearm being
33 sold, delivered, or transferred shall be entered into the Automated
34 Firearms System (AFS) via the California Law Enforcement
35 Telecommunications System (CLETS) by the law enforcement or
36 state agency that sold, delivered, or transferred the firearm,

4 26615. (a) Section 26500 does not apply to the sale, delivery,
5 or transfer of a firearm by a law enforcement agency to a retiring
6 peace officer who is authorized to carry a firearm pursuant to
7 Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 26300) of Division 5.

8 (b) Within 10 days of the date that a handgun, and commencing
9 January 1, 2013, any firearm, is sold, delivered, or transferred to
10 that retiring peace officer, the name of the officer and the make,
