LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 913, as amended, Feuer. ~~Environment:~~ *Hazardous waste: source reduction: certified green business program.*

The existing Hazardous Waste Source Reduction and Management Review Act of 1989 requires the Department of Toxic Substances Control to establish a program for hazardous waste source reduction, including requiring specified generators of hazardous waste to maintain certain plans and reports with regard to hazardous waste reduction practices. The department is required to provide source reduction training and resources to various regional and local government assistance programs to identify and apply source reduction methods.

This bill would require the department, as part of implementing this program, to develop a California Green Business Program that provides for the voluntary certification of businesses that adopt environmentally preferable business practices, including, but not limited to, increased energy efficiency, reduced greenhouse gas emissions, promotion of water conservation, and reduced waste generation. The department would be required to take specified actions with regard to implementing the California Green Business Program.

~~This bill would declare the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to establish a program to provide for the voluntary certification of businesses that adopt environmentally preferable business practices.~~

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 *SECTION 1. The Legislature finds and declares all of the*
- 2 *following:*
- 3 *(a) The California Green Business Program is a statewide*
- 4 *network of local government programs that certify small- to*
- 5 *medium-sized businesses as having adopted environmentally*
- 6 *preferable business practices.*
- 7 *(b) These local government programs coordinate with other*
- 8 *programs in their jurisdictions to assist businesses with achieving*
- 9 *and moving beyond regulatory compliance.*
- 10 *(c) Businesses certified by this program implement multimedia*
- 11 *pollution prevention activities to achieve measurable waste*
- 12 *reduction, energy savings, water conservation, and sustainability,*
- 13 *in consultation with local governments, utility providers, and other*
- 14 *entities.*
- 15 *(d) The California Green Business Program promotes improved*
- 16 *community health outcomes, economic vitality, sustainability, and*
- 17 *green jobs.*
- 18 *(e) The California Green Business Program provides small*
- 19 *businesses with a level and quality of consultation on*
- 20 *environmentally preferable business practices that small businesses*
- 21 *otherwise may have limited access.*
- 22 *(f) The California Green Business Program can save businesses*
- 23 *money through coordinating with funding opportunities for*
- 24 *efficiency upgrades and long-term savings associated with*
- 25 *decreased utility bills.*
- 26 *(g) The Department of Toxic Substances Control serves as a*
- 27 *statewide program contact, coordinator, and liaison with other*
- 28 *state agencies, consistent with subdivision (h) of Section 25244.13*
- 29 *of the Health and Safety Code.*
- 30 *(h) In California there are currently 14 county and two city*
- 31 *green business programs, which have together certified over 2,600*
- 32 *green businesses.*

1 *SEC. 2. Section 25244.17.2 of the Health and Safety Code is*

3 25244.17.2. The department shall expand the department's
4 source reduction program to provide source reduction training and
5 resources to CUPAs, small business development corporations,
6 business environmental assistance centers, and other regional and
7 local government environmental programs so that they can provide
8 technical assistance to generators in identifying and applying
9 methods of source reduction.

10 (a) The program expanded pursuant to this section shall
11 emphasize activities necessary to implement Sections 25244.17
12 and 25244.17.1.

13 ***(b) As part of implementing the program required by this***
14 ***section, the department shall develop a California Green Business***
15 ***Program that provides for the voluntary certification of businesses***
16 ***that adopt environmentally preferable business practices,***
17 ***including, but not limited to, increased energy efficiency, reduced***
18 ***greenhouse gas emissions, promotion of water conservation, and***
19 ***reduced waste generation. The department's California Green***
20 ***Business Program shall do all of the following:***

21 ***(1) Assist the network of statewide local government programs***
22 ***in implementing guidelines and structures that establish and***
23 ***promote a level of consistency among green business programs***
24 ***across the state.***

25 ***(2) Support, through staffing and contracts, the development***
26 ***and maintenance of a statewide database to register businesses***
27 ***and track measurable pollution reductions and cost savings.***

28 ***(3) Solicit participation of additional local programs and***
29 ***facilitate the startup of new local programs.***

30 ***(4) Develop technical guidance on pollution prevention***
31 ***measures, conduct industry studies and pilot projects, and provide***
32 ***policy coordination for the participating local programs.***

34 (c) The department shall determine, in consultation with the
35 advisory committee, the most effective methods to promote
36 implementation of source reduction education programs by CUPAs,
37 small business development corporations, business environmental
38 assistance centers, and other regional and local government
39 environmental programs. Program elements may include, but are
40 not limited to, all of the following:

1 (1) Sponsoring workshops, conferences, technology fairs, and
2 other training events.

3 (2) Sponsoring regional training groups, such as the regional
4 hazardous waste reduction committees.

5 (3) Developing and distributing educational materials, such as
6 short descriptions of successful source reduction projects and
7 materials explaining how source reduction has been used by
8 businesses to achieve compliance with environmental laws
9 enforced by local governments.

10 (4) Developing site review checklists, training manuals, and
11 technical resource manuals and using those resources to train
12 CUPAs, small business development corporations, business
13 environmental assistance centers, and other regional and local
14 government environmental programs.

15 (5) Preparing and distributing resource lists such as lists of
16 vendors, consultants, or providers of financial assistance for source
17 reduction projects.

18 (6) Serving as an information clearinghouse to support telephone
19 and onsite consultants with local governments.

22 (d) Each fiscal year, the department shall provide training and
23 information resources to at least 90 percent of CUPAs.

26 green business program that would provide for the voluntary
27 certification of businesses that adopt environmentally preferable
28 business practices including, but not limited to, increased energy
29 efficiency, reduced greenhouse gas emissions, and reduced waste
