An act to amend Section 1294 of the Code of Civil Procedure, relating to arbitration.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1062, as amended, Dickinson. Arbitration: appeals.

Existing law specifies those types of orders and judgments from which an appeal may be taken, including, an order dismissing or denying a petition to compel arbitration.

This bill would ~~delete an order dismissing or denying a petition to compel arbitration as a~~ *limit that* basis from which an appeal may be taken *to an order dismissing or denying a petition to compel arbitration pursuant to the terms of a public or private sector collective bargaining agreement.*
