~~An act to amend Section 66602 of the Education Code, relating to public postsecondary education. An act to amend Section 65007 of the Government Code, and to amend Section 9610 of the Water Code, relating to land use.~~

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1965, as amended, Pan. ~~California State University: trustees: student members: voting at board meetings.~~ *Land use.*

Existing law requires the Department of Water Resources to develop preliminary maps for the 100- and 200-year flood plains protected by project levees, as specified, and to provide the preliminary maps to cities and counties within the Sacramento-San Joaquin Valley.

This bill would additionally require the department, on or before July 2, 2013, to release floodplain maps, as specified, and the available data as to the water surface elevation of flooding in urban areas, as specified. The bill would provide that the department's issuance of floodplain maps are not subject to the review and approval of the Office of Administrative Law, as specified. The bill would provide that the state

or any state agency is not liable for any claim based upon the reasonable exercise or performance of a discretionary or ministerial function or duty pursuant to this provision. The bill would incorporate additional changes pursuant to SB 1278, as specified.

This bill would become operative only if SB 1278 is enacted and takes effect on or before January 1, 2013, and this bill is enacted last.

~~Existing law establishes the California State University, under the administration of the Trustees of the California State University, as one of the segments of public postsecondary education in this state. Under existing law, the trustees are composed of a total of 25 members, which include 5 specified ex officio members, a representative of the alumni associations of the university, 16 members appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by $\frac{2}{3}$ of the membership of the Senate, for 8-year terms, and 2 California State University students and one California State University faculty member appointed by the Governor for 2-year terms. Existing law prohibits a student member from voting at a board meeting during the first year of his or her term.~~

~~This bill would authorize a student member to vote at a board meeting during the first year of his or her term if the other student member is absent from that meeting.~~

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 65007 of the Government Code is
2 amended to read:
3 65007. As used in this title, the following terms have the
4 following meanings, unless the context requires otherwise:
5 (a) “Adequate progress” means all of the following:
6 (1) The total project scope, schedule, and cost of the completed
7 flood protection system have been developed to meet the
8 appropriate standard of protection.
9 (2) (A) Revenues that are sufficient to fund each year of the
10 project schedule developed in paragraph (1) have been identified
11 and, in any given year and consistent with that schedule, at least
12 90 percent of the revenues scheduled to be received by that year
13 have been appropriated and are currently being expended.
14 (B) Notwithstanding subparagraph (A), for any year in which
15 state funding is not appropriated consistent with an agreement

1 between a state agency and a local flood management agency, the
2 Central Valley Flood Protection Board may find that the local
3 flood management agency is making adequate progress in working
4 toward the completion of the flood protection system.

5 (3) Critical features of the flood protection system are under
6 construction, and each critical feature is progressing as indicated
7 by the actual expenditure of the construction budget funds.

8 (4) The city or county has not been responsible for a significant
9 delay in the completion of the system.

10 (5) The local flood management agency shall provide the
11 Department of Water Resources and the Central Valley Flood
12 Protection Board with the information specified in this subdivision
13 sufficient to determine substantial completion of the required flood
14 protection. The local flood management agency shall annually
15 report to the Central Valley Flood Protection Board on the efforts
16 in working toward completion of the flood protection system.

17 (b) “Central Valley Flood Protection Plan” has the same
18 meaning as that set forth in Section 9612 of the Water Code.

19 (c) “Developed area” has the same meaning as that set forth in
20 Section 59.1 of Title 44 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

21 (d) “Flood hazard zone” means an area subject to flooding that
22 is delineated as either a special hazard area or an area of moderate
23 hazard on an official flood insurance rate map issued by the Federal
24 Emergency Management Agency. The identification of flood
25 hazard zones does not imply that areas outside the flood hazard
26 zones, or uses permitted within flood hazard zones, will be free
27 from flooding or flood damage.

28 (e) *“National Federal Emergency Management Agency standard
29 of flood protection” means the level of flood protection that is
30 necessary to withstand flooding that has a 1-in-100 chance of
31 occurring in any given year using criteria developed by the Federal
32 Emergency Management Agency for application in the National
33 Flood Insurance Program.*

35 (f) “Nonurbanized area” means a developed area or an area
36 outside a developed area in which there are fewer than 10,000
37 residents *that is not an urbanizing area.*

39 (g) “Project levee” means any levee that is part of the facilities
40 of the State Plan of Flood Control.

 2 (h) “Sacramento-San Joaquin Valley” means lands in the bed
 3 or along or near the banks of the Sacramento River or San Joaquin
 4 River, or their tributaries or connected therewith, or upon any land
 5 adjacent thereto, or within the overflow basins thereof, or upon
 6 land susceptible to overflow therefrom. The Sacramento-San
 7 Joaquin Valley does not include lands lying within the Tulare Lake
 8 basin, including the Kings River.

 10 (i) “State Plan of Flood Control” has the same meaning as that
 11 set forth in subdivision (j) of Section 5096.805 of the Public
 12 Resources Code.

 14 (j) “Tulare Lake basin” means the Tulare Lake Hydrologic
 15 Region as defined in the California Water Plan Update 2009,
 16 prepared by the Department of Water Resources pursuant to
 17 Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 10004) of Part 1.5 of Division
 18 6 of the Water Code.

 20 (k) *“Undetermined risk area” means an urban or urbanizing*
 21 *area within a moderate flood hazard zone, as delineated on an*
 22 *official flood insurance rate map issued by the Federal Emergency*
 23 *Management Agency, which has not been determined to have an*
 24 *urban level of protection.*

 26 (l) “Urban area” means a developed area in which there are
 27 10,000 residents or more.

28 (m) “Urbanizing area” means a developed area or an area outside
 29 a developed area that is planned or anticipated to have 10,000
 30 residents or more within the next 10 years.

 32 (n) “Urban level of flood protection” means the level of
 33 protection that is necessary to withstand flooding that has a
 34 1-in-200 chance of occurring in any given year using criteria
 35 consistent with, or developed by, the Department of Water
 36 Resources. *“Urban level of flood protection” shall not mean*
 37 *shallow flooding or flooding from local drainage that meets the*
 38 *criteria of the national Federal Emergency Management Agency*
 39 *standard of flood protection.*

40 SEC. 2. Section 9610 of the Water Code is amended to read:

1 9610. (a) (1) By July 1, 2008, the department shall develop
2 preliminary maps for the 100- and 200-year flood plains protected
3 by project levees. The 100-year flood plain maps shall be prepared
4 using criteria developed or accepted by the Federal Emergency
5 Management Agency (FEMA).

6 (2) The department shall use available information from the
7 ~~2002 Sacramento-San Joaquin~~ *Sacramento and San Joaquin River*
8 ~~Basin~~ *Basins* Comprehensive Study, preliminary and regulatory
9 FEMA flood insurance rate maps, recent flood plain studies, and
10 other sources to compile preliminary maps.

11 (3) The department shall provide the preliminary maps to cities
12 and counties within the Sacramento-San Joaquin Valley for use
13 as best available information relating to flood protection.

14 (4) The department shall post this information on the board's
15 Internet Web site and may periodically update the maps as
16 necessary.

17 (b) By July 1, 2008, the department shall give notice to cities
18 in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Valley outside areas protected by
19 project levees regarding maps and other information as to flood
20 risks available from the Federal Emergency Management Agency
21 or another federal, state, or local agency.

22 (c) On or before December 31, 2010, the department shall
23 prepare a status report on the progress and development of the
24 Central Valley Flood Protection Plan pursuant to Section 9612.
25 The department shall post this information on the board's Internet
26 Web site, and make it available to the public.

27 (d) (1) *On or before July 2, 2013, and for the purpose of*
28 *providing information to cities and counties necessary for their*
29 *determinations relating to level of flood protection, the department*
30 *shall release floodplain maps that identify at a minimum the*
31 *facilities of the State Plan of Flood Control and the available data*
32 *as to the water surface elevation of flooding in urban areas in the*
33 *event of the failure of the facilities of the State Plan of Flood*
34 *Control during flooding that has a 1-in-200 chance of occurring*
35 *in any given year.*

36 (2) *Concurrent with the release of these maps and for the*
37 *purpose of assisting local agencies in determining their level of*
38 *flood protection, the department shall make available levee*
39 *reliability data for the facilities of the State Plan of Flood Control*
40 *identified in the maps.*

1 (e) The department's issuance of floodplain maps shall not be
2 subject to the review and approval of the Office of Administrative
3 Law or to any other requirements of Chapter 3.5 (commencing
4 with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the
5 Government Code.

6 (f) The state, or any state agency, shall not be liable for any
7 claim based upon the reasonable exercise or performance of a
8 discretionary or ministerial function or duty on the part of a state
9 agency or a state employee or officer in carrying out subdivision
10 (d).

11 SEC. 3. This act shall become operative only if Senate Bill
12 1278 is enacted and takes effect on or before January 1, 2013, and
13 this bill is enacted last.

16 66602. (a) ~~The board shall be composed of the following five~~
17 ~~ex-officio members: the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the~~
18 ~~Superintendent of Public Instruction, the Speaker of the Assembly,~~
19 ~~and the person named by the trustees to serve as the Chancellor~~
20 ~~of the California State University; a representative of the alumni~~
21 ~~associations of the state university, selected for a two-year term~~
22 ~~by the alumni council, California State University, which~~
23 ~~representative shall not be an employee of the California State~~
24 ~~University during the two-year term; and 16 appointive members~~

6 ~~Notwithstanding paragraph (1), a student member who graduates~~

11 ~~student member shall be a member of the board and may attend~~
