An act to add *and repeal* Part 3.5 (commencing with Section 128590) ~~to~~ of Division 107 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to health workforce development.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2214, as amended, Monning. Health workforce development.

Existing law requires the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development within the California Health and Human Services Agency to, among other things, (1) develop a Health Manpower Plan for California that consists of, among other things, appropriate standards for determining the adequacy of supply of specified health personnel, (2) maintain a Health Professions Career Opportunity Program that includes supporting and encouraging minority health professionals in training to practice in health professional shortage areas, and (3) establish a health care workforce clearinghouse to serve as the central source of health care workforce and educational data in the state.

Existing law, the Song-Brown Health Care Workforce Training Act, creates the California Healthcare Workforce Policy Commission to, among other things, identify specific areas of the state where unmet priority needs for primary care family physicians and registered nurses exist.

Existing law establishes the California Workforce Investment Board within the Labor and Workforce Development Agency to assist the Governor in the development, oversight, and continuous improvement of California’s workforce investment system.

This bill would require, *until January 1, 2019*, the California Workforce Investment Board to establish the Health Workforce Development Council to help expand California’s health workforce in order to provide access to quality health care for all Californians. The bill would require the council to perform certain duties, including establishing a statewide plan for health workforce development, as specified. It would require the council to inform the Legislature of its health initiatives and progress, as specified.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Part 3.5 (commencing with Section 128590) is
2 added to Division 107 of the Health and Safety Code, to read:

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4 PART 3.5. HEALTH WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

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6 128590. (a) The California Workforce Investment Board shall
7 establish a special committee known as the Health Workforce
8 Development Council to help expand the state’s health workforce
9 in order to provide access to quality health care for all Californians.
10 In this regard, it is the intent of the Legislature to expand the state’s
11 full-time primary care workforce between 2013 and 2023. The
12 membership of the council shall consist of the appropriate
13 representatives from the board’s existing membership, as well as
14 representatives from other state agencies and departments, higher
15 education, labor, the health care industry, workforce groups,
16 philanthropic and nongovernmental entities, and other appropriate
17 health advocates.

18 (b) The council shall do all of the following:

19 (1) Develop a comprehensive statewide plan and implementation
20 strategy for health workforce development through strategic
21 partnerships.

1 (2) Examine proven strategies and policies to increase health
2 workforce supply that can be replicated and deployed through
3 sector strategy and other models.

4 (3) Provide guidance on the development and maturation of
5 regional health workforce partnerships to address regional health
6 care and delivery system needs.

7 (4) Use regional partnerships to identify and inform regional
8 and statewide health workforce development priorities.

9 (5) Seek expertise from multisector representatives to enhance
10 the understanding of the issues and policies needed to ensure that
11 California has the necessary workforce to provide access to quality,
12 *and* culturally, and linguistically appropriate, health care.

13 (c) The board representative on the council shall be the chair
14 of the council.

15 (d) (1) The council shall inform the Legislature of its health
16 initiatives and progress by providing the Legislature with a copy
17 of the board's annual report to the federal Department of Labor.

18 (2) The report submitted pursuant to paragraph (1) shall be
19 submitted in compliance with Section 9795 of the Government
20 Code.

21 (e) For purposes of this part:

22 (1) "Board" means the California Workforce Investment Board.

23 (2) "Council" means the Health Workforce Development
24 Council.

25 *128591. This part shall remain in effect only until January 1,*
26 *2019, and as of that date is repealed, unless a later enacted statute,*
27 *that is enacted before January 1, 2019, deletes or extends that*
28 *date.*
