An act to amend Section 11564.5 of, and to add Section 11564.7 to, the Government Code, relating to state boards and commissions.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 153, as introduced, Strickland. State boards and commissions: salaries: suspension.

Existing law provides for the payment of specified salaries to the members of various state boards and commissions. A member of a state board or commission may receive a per diem salary at a specified rate, except for a member whose salary is set pursuant to certain provisions of law.

This bill would prohibit members appointed to specified state boards and commissions from receiving a salary for the 2012–13, 2013–14, and 2014–15 fiscal years. This bill would authorize a member of a state board or commission who is prohibited from receiving a salary under these provisions to receive a specified per diem payment during those fiscal years.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 11564.5 of the Government Code is  
2 amended to read:  
3 11564.5. (a) Notwithstanding any other ~~provision~~ of law,  
4 whenever a member of a board, commission, committee, or  
5 similarly constituted body created by executive order or statute,

1 is authorized to receive a per diem salary or allowance in excess  
2 of expenses incurred by the member, that rate shall be established  
3 at one hundred dollars (\$100) per day unless a higher rate is  
4 provided by statute. ~~This~~

5 (b) *Except as provided in Section 11564.7, this section shall not*  
6 *apply to those boards or commissions provided an annual salary*  
7 *in this chapter, nor to the board specified in Section 1150 of the*  
8 *Harbors and Navigation Code.*

9 SEC. 2. Section 11564.7 is added to the Government Code, to  
10 read:

11 11564.7. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, members  
12 appointed to the following entities shall receive no salary for the  
13 2012–13, 2013–14, and 2014–15 fiscal years:

- 14 (1) The Agricultural Labor Relations Board.
- 15 (2) The Alcoholic Beverage Control Appeals Board.
- 16 (3) The California Gambling Control Commission.
- 17 (4) The California Medical Assistance Commission.
- 18 (5) The California Unemployment Insurance Appeals Board.
- 19 (6) The Occupational Safety and Health Appeals Board.
- 20 (7) The Public Employment Relations Board.
- 21 (8) The State Air Resources Board.
- 22 (9) The State Personnel Board.
- 23 (10) The State Water Resources Control Board.
- 24 (11) The Workers’ Compensation Appeals Board.

25 (b) An individual described in this section may receive a per  
26 diem payment determined pursuant to Section 11564.5 for the  
27 period described in subdivision (a).

28 (c) This section shall not apply to employees of the entities  
29 described in paragraphs (1) to (11), inclusive, of subdivision (a).
