An act relating to a veterans' memorial.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 443, as amended, Strickland. Veterans' memorial.

Existing law provides that the Department of Transportation has full possession and control of all state highways. Existing law authorizes the department to enter into an agreement to accept funds, materials, equipment, or services from any person for maintenance or roadside enhancement.

This bill would require the Department of Transportation, if nonstate funds are available for this purpose, including for repair and ongoing maintenance, to erect a veterans' memorial in a specified state-owned park and ride parking lot in the town of Orcutt, in consultation with the Old Town Orcutt Revitalization Association. The bill would authorize the department to enter into agreements with the association for the planning, construction, and maintenance of the memorial.

This bill would make legislative findings and declarations as to the necessity of a special statute for the town of Orcutt.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes.
State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Department of Transportation, if nonstate
2 funds are available for this purpose, including for repair and
3 ongoing maintenance, shall erect a veterans' memorial in the
4 state-owned park and ride parking lot at the ~~Clarke~~ Clark Avenue
5 West exit from State Highway Route 135 in the town of Orcutt,
6 in consultation with the Old Town Orcutt Revitalization
7 Association. The department may enter into agreements with the
8 association for the planning, construction, and maintenance of the
9 memorial.

10 SEC. 2. The Legislature finds and declares that a special law
11 is necessary and that a general law cannot be made applicable
12 within the meaning of Section 16 of Article IV of the California
13 Constitution because of the unique need to erect a veterans'
14 memorial in Orcutt in *the town of* a publicly accessible location.
