LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 910, as introduced, Lowenthal. Vehicles: bicycles: passing distance.

Existing law imposes various operational and equipment requirements on a person riding a bicycle on highways and roads in the state, and requires that the driver of a vehicle overtaking a bicycle in the same direction pass to the left at a safe distance without interfering with the safe operation of the overtaken bicycle.

This bill would declare the intent of the Legislature to enact subsequent legislation that would establish a minimum passing distance that would be required of motorists who are passing bicyclists on highways and roads in the state.
