~~An act to amend Section 10389.1 of the Public Contract Code, relating to public contracts.~~ *An act to amend Section 12803.65 of the Government Code, relating to workforce development.*

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 919, as amended, Lieu. ~~Public contracts: Department of General Services: school districts: state surplus personal property.~~ *Labor and Workforce Development Agency: California Governor's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities.*

Existing law provides for the establishment of the California Governor's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities, to include a specified membership.

This bill would include the Superintendent of Public Instruction within the membership of the committee.

~~Existing law requires the Department of General Services to first offer appropriate state surplus personal property to school districts prior to offering that property to the public, except as otherwise provided, and requires the department to develop policies and procedures for this purpose.~~

~~This bill would make a technical, nonsubstantive change to this provision.~~

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 12803.65 of the Government Code is
2 amended to read:

3 12803.65. (a) The Governor shall rename and establish, in the
4 Labor and Workforce Development Agency, the existing California
5 Governor’s Committee on Employment of Disabled Persons as
6 the “California Governor’s Committee on Employment of People
7 with Disabilities” or “CGCEPD.”

8 (b) (1) The California Governor’s Committee on Employment
9 of People with Disabilities shall include, but not be limited to, the
10 following:

11 (A) Four individuals with disabilities representing disabled
12 persons, two appointed by the Governor and one each appointed
13 by the Senate Committee on Rules and the Speaker of the
14 Assembly, each for a three-year term.

15 (B) The Directors of the Employment Development Department,
16 State Department of Health Care Services, State Department of
17 Mental Health, State Department of Developmental Services, State
18 Department of Social Services, and Department of Rehabilitation,
19 the Superintendent of Public Instruction, and the Chair of the State
20 Independent Living Council.

21 (C) Representatives from the State Department of Health Care
22 Services’ California Health Incentive Improvement Project.

23 (D) A representative from the California Workforce Investment
24 Board.

25 (E) Representatives from any other department or program that
26 may have a role in increasing the capacity of state programs to
27 support the employment-related needs of individuals with
28 disabilities.

29 (F) A representative from a local one-stop or local workforce
30 investment board, to be appointed by the Governor.

31 (G) A business representative with experience in employing
32 persons with disabilities, to be appointed by the Governor.

33 (2) The members of the California Governor’s Committee on
34 Employment of People with Disabilities shall select a chair from
35 among the members, and shall hold open meetings no less than
36 quarterly.

37 (c) The California Governor’s Committee on Employment of
38 People with Disabilities shall consult with and advise the Labor

1 and Workforce Development Agency and the California Health
2 and Human Services Agency on all issues related to full inclusion
3 in the workforce of persons with disabilities, including
4 development of the comprehensive strategy required pursuant to
5 Section 12803.6 and implementation of the grant program
6 established pursuant to Section 12803.7.

7 (d) The California Governor’s Committee on Employment of
8 People with Disabilities shall also:

9 (1) Coordinate and provide leadership, as necessary, with regard
10 to efforts to increase inclusion in the workforce of persons with
11 disabilities.

12 (2) Report annually to the Legislature and the Governor on the
13 employment status of Californians with disabilities.

14 (e) The California Governor’s Committee on Employment of
15 People with Disabilities shall provide support to the State
16 Workforce Investment Board and the local one-stop centers in
17 their efforts to achieve full compliance with Sections 18002, 18004,
18 18006, and 18008 of the Unemployment Insurance Code, and shall
19 identify the extent to which any ~~one-stops~~ *one-stop centers* are not
20 in full compliance with those sections and the reasons for the lack
21 of compliance, including the need for additional resources.

22 (f) The California Governor’s Committee on Employment of
23 People with Disabilities shall meet quarterly with the California
24 Health Incentive Improvement Project, administered by the State
25 Department of Health *Care* Services, and the project’s steering
26 committee, to the extent funding for the project continues and the
27 activities of the California Governor’s Committee on Employment
28 of People with Disabilities are not inconsistent with the charge of
29 the California Health Incentive Improvement Project.

30 (g) Using existing funding, the California Governor’s Committee
31 on Employment of People with Disabilities shall facilitate, promote,
32 and coordinate collaborative dissemination of information on
33 employment supports and benefits, which shall include the Ticket
34 to Work program and health benefits, to individuals with
35 disabilities, consumers of public services, employers, service
36 providers, and state and local agency staff.

37 (h) Using existing funding, the California Governor’s Committee
38 on Employment of People with Disabilities shall receive primary
39 administrative and staff support from the State Employment
40 Development Department.

3 10389.1. ~~The Department of General Services, if feasible and~~
4 ~~consistent with existing law, shall first offer appropriate state~~
5 ~~surplus personal property to school districts before offering that~~
6 ~~property to the public, except for property more appropriately~~
7 ~~suited for public safety uses. The department may offer school~~
8 ~~districts state surplus personal property at less than fair market~~
9 ~~value, if it is determined by the Director of General Services to be~~
10 ~~in the best interests of the state. The department shall develop~~
11 ~~policies and procedures for the implementation of this article.~~

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
