An act to add Section 89517.5 to the Education Code, relating to postsecondary education, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 952, as introduced, Alquist. California State University: compensation.

Existing law establishes the California State University, under the administration of the Trustees of the California State University, as one of the segments of public postsecondary education in the state.

This bill would prohibit, on or after July 1, 2012, the Trustees of the California State University from entering into, or renewing, a contract that provides for a compensation increase for any administrator of more than 10% using General Fund moneys in the fiscal year during which the contract is executed, relative to the immediately past contract for that same position, if in that same fiscal year there has been a tuition or fee increase.

This bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 89517.5 is added to the Education Code,
- 2 to read:

1 89517.5. On or after July 1, 2012, the Trustees of the California
2 State University shall not enter into, or renew, a contract that
3 provides for a compensation increase for any administrator of more
4 than 10 percent using General Fund moneys in the fiscal year
5 during which the contract is executed, relative to the immediately
6 past contract for that same position, if in that same fiscal year there
7 has been a tuition or fee increase.

8 SEC. 2. This act is an urgency statute necessary for the
9 immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety within
10 the meaning of Article IV of the Constitution and shall go into
11 immediate effect. The facts constituting the necessity are:

12 In order to respond to and alleviate the effects of the state's
13 current fiscal crisis and the resulting additional budget cuts and
14 tuition increases for the California State University, it is necessary
15 for this act to take effect immediately.
