**SENATE BILL**

**No. 1065**

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**Introduced by Senator Kehoe**

February 13, 2012

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An act relating to state claims, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1065, as amended, Kehoe. State claims.

Existing law requires the California Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board to report to the Legislature when a sufficient appropriation is not available for the payment of a claim against the state allowed by the board.

This bill would appropriate ~~\$167,329.15~~ \$624,671.86 from the General Fund to the Executive Officer of the California Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board to pay claims accepted by the board. The bill would require the Controller, upon the request of the board, in a form prescribed by the Controller, to transfer surcharges and fees from the specified Budget Act item of appropriation identified in the bill to Item 1870-001-0001 of Section 2.00 of the Budget Act of 2012.

This bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. (a) The sum of ~~one hundred sixty-seven thousand~~  
 2 ~~three hundred twenty-nine dollars and fifteen cents (\$167,329.15)~~  
 3 *six hundred twenty-four thousand six hundred seventy-one dollars*  
 4 *and eighty-six cents (\$624,671.86)* is hereby appropriated from  
 5 the fund specified in subdivision (b) to the Executive Officer of  
 6 the California Victim Compensation and Government Claims  
 7 Board for the payment of claims accepted by the board ~~in~~  
 8 ~~accordance with~~ *pursuant to* the schedule set forth in subdivision  
 9 (b).

10 (b) Pursuant to subdivision (a), claims accepted by the California  
 11 Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board shall be paid  
 12 ~~in accordance with~~ *pursuant to* the following schedule:

 27 SEC. 2. Upon the request of the California Victim  
 28 Compensation and Government Claims Board, in a form prescribed  
 29 by the Controller, the Controller shall transfer surcharges and fees  
 30 from the Budget Act items of appropriation identified in  
 31 subdivision (b) of Section 1 of this act to Item 1870-001-0001 of  
 32 Section 2.00 of the Budget Act of 2012. For each Budget Act item  
 33 of appropriation, this amount shall not exceed the cumulative total  
 34 of the per claim filing fees authorized by subdivision (c) of Section  
 35 905.2 of the Government Code and the surcharge authorized by  
 36 subdivision (f) of Section 905.2 of the Government Code. For  
 37 those items in subdivision (b) that do not reflect a Budget Act  
 38 appropriation, the Controller shall transfer an amount not to exceed

1 the cumulative total of the per claim filing fees authorized by  
2 subdivision (c) of Section 905.2 of the Government Code and the  
3 surcharge authorized by subdivision (f) of Section 905.2 of the  
4 Government Code. This amount shall be transferred for the support  
5 of the board as reimbursements to Item 1870-001-0001 of Section  
6 2.00 of the Budget Act of 2012. The board shall provide a report  
7 of the amounts recovered pursuant to this authority to the  
8 Department of Finance within 90 days of the enactment of this  
9 act.

10 SEC. 3. This act is an urgency statute necessary for the  
11 immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety within  
12 the meaning of Article IV of the Constitution and shall go into  
13 immediate effect. The facts constituting the necessity are:

14 In order to settle claims against the state and end hardship to  
15 claimants as quickly as possible, it is necessary for this act to take  
16 effect immediately.
