SENATE BILL

No. 1233

Introduced by Senator Padilla

February 23, 2012

An act to amend Sections 9001, *9002*, 9004, and 9006 of, and to add Sections 9006.5 and 9023 to, the Elections Code, relating to elections.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1233, as amended, Padilla. Initiative and referendum petitions: translation of circulating title and summary.

Existing law requires the Attorney General, upon receipt of the text of a proposed initiative or referendum measure, to prepare a circulating title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure. Existing law requires the Attorney General to provide a copy of the circulating title and summary of a proposed initiative measure to the proponents of the measure and the Secretary of State within 15 days, as specified. Existing law requires the Attorney General to provide a copy of the circulating title and summary of a proposed referendum measure to the proponents of the measure and the Secretary of State within 10 days after receipt of the proposed referendum.

This bill would require the proponents of an initiative or referendum measure, at the time of submitting the text of the proposed measure to the Attorney General, to submit a list of specified counties in which the initiative or referendum petition will be circulated. If the proponents submit this list of counties, this bill would require the Attorney General to provide a copy of the circulating title and summary and the list of

the counties identified by the proponents to the Secretary of State. Upon receipt submission of these items the list, this bill would require the Secretary of State Attorney General to prepare a translation of the circulating title and summary of the proposed initiative or referendum measure in each applicable minority language of the counties identified by the proponents a language other than English under certain circumstances. If the Secretary of State Attorney General is required to prepare a translation, this bill would require the Secretary of State Attorney General to provide a copy of the circulating title and summary and its translation to the proponents and the county elections officials, as specified, within 10 days Secretary of State within 25 days, as specified, for a proposed initiative measure and within 20 days after receipt of a proposed referendum measure.

Existing law permits any person who is a voter or who is qualified to register to vote in the state to circulate an initiative or referendum petition for signature and imposes certain requirements on these circulators.

This bill would require the circulator of an initiative or referendum petition to make available a copy of the translated circulating title and summary to each person whom the circulator solicits in that language to sign the petition and to provide a copy of the translated circulating title and summary to any person upon request.

(a) (1) Prior to the circulation of an initiative or 4 referendum petition for signatures, the text of the proposed measure 5 shall be submitted to the Attorney General with a written request that a circulating title and summary of the chief purpose and points 6 7 of the proposed measure be prepared. The electors presenting the 8 request shall be known as the "proponents." The Attorney General 9 shall preserve the written request until after the next general 10 election. 11 (2) The proponents of an initiative or referendum measure, at

12 the time of submitting the text of the proposed measure to the 13 Attorney General, shall submit to the Attorney General a list of

the counties in which the petition will be circulated that are covered 1

2 by Section 203 (42 U.S.C. Sec. 1973aa-1a) or Section 4(f)(4) (42

3 U.S.C. Sec. 1973b(f)(4)) of the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965.

4 (b) Each proponent of a proposed initiative measure shall, at 5 the time of submitting the text of the proposed measure, provide 6 both of the following:

7 (1) An original signed certification stating that "I, (insert name), 8 declare under penalty of perjury that I am a citizen of the United 9 States, 18 years of age or older, and a resident of (insert county),

10 California."

(2) Public contact information.

12 (c) The proponents of an initiative measure, at the time of 13 submitting the text of the proposed measure to the Attorney 14 General, shall pay a fee of two hundred dollars (\$200), which shall 15 be placed in a trust fund in the office of the Treasurer and refunded 16 to the proponents if the measure qualifies for the ballot within two 17 years from the date the summary is furnished to the proponents. 18 If the measure does not qualify within that period, the fee shall be 19

immediately paid into the General Fund of the state.

20 (d) All referenda and proposed initiative measures shall be

21 submitted to the Attorney General's Initiative Coordinator located

22 in the Sacramento Attorney General's Office via United States

23 Postal Service, alternative mail service, or personal delivery. Only 24

printed documents will be accepted; facsimile or e-mail delivery 25 will not be accepted.

26 (e) The Attorney General shall not deem a request for a 27 circulating title and summary submitted until all of the 28 requirements of this section are met.

(a) The Except as provided in subdivision (c) of Section 31 9004, the Attorney General shall provide a copy of the title and 32 summary to the Secretary of State within 15 days after receipt of 33 the final version of a proposed initiative measure, or, if a fiscal 34 estimate or opinion is to be included, within 15 days after receipt of the fiscal estimate or opinion prepared by the Department of 35 36 Finance and the Joint Legislative Budget Committee pursuant to 37 Section 9005. If during the 15-day period the proponents of the 38 proposed initiative measure submit amendments, other than 39 technical, nonsubstantive amendments, to the final version of the 40 measure, the Attorney General shall provide a copy of the title and
