An act relating to the University of California, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately to amend Section 4003.5 of the Vehicle Code, relating to vehicles.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 27, as amended, Medina. ~~University of California: UC Riverside Medical School: funding.~~ Vehicles: registration: one-trip permits.

Existing law prohibits a person from driving any motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer unless it is registered and the appropriate fees have been paid to the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), or it is registered under the permanent trailer identification program, except as specified. Existing law requires the DMV to issue a one-trip permit to a vehicle manufacturer or dealer, upon payment of a \$35 fee, which authorizes an unregistered trailer, semitrailer, or auxiliary dolly to be moved or operated laden within the state for not more than 5 days as

part of one continuous trip from the place of manufacture, dispatch, or entry into this state to a place where the vehicle will be offered for sale.

This bill would extend the period in which these vehicles may operate under a permit to 30 days.

~~Existing provisions of the California Constitution establish the University of California as a public trust under the administration of the Regents of the University of California. The University of California system includes 10 campuses, which are located in Berkeley, Davis, Irvine, Los Angeles, Merced, Riverside, San Diego, San Francisco, Santa Barbara, and Santa Cruz.~~

~~This bill would state various legislative findings and declarations relating to the School of Medicine at the University of California, Riverside. The bill would request the School of Medicine at the University of California, Riverside, to develop a program, consistent with its mission, in conjunction with the health facilities of its medical residency programs, to identify eligible medical residents and to assist those medical residents to apply for physician retention programs, including, but not limited to, the Steven M. Thompson Medical School Scholarship Program.~~

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 4003.5 of the Vehicle Code is amended
2 to read:

3 4003.5. (a) Upon payment of the fee specified in Section
4 9258.5, the department shall issue to a manufacturer or dealer a
5 one-trip permit authorizing a new trailer, semitrailer, or auxiliary
6 dolly ~~which~~ *that* has never been registered in any state, or a used
7 trailer, semitrailer, or auxiliary dolly ~~which~~ *that* is not currently
8 registered, to be moved or operated laden within, entering, or
9 leaving this state for not more than ~~five~~ 30 days as part of one
10 continuous trip from the place of manufacture for a new vehicle,
11 or from the place of dispatch or entry into this state for a used
12 vehicle, to a place where the vehicle will be offered for sale.

13 (b) Any permit issued pursuant to this section authorizes the
14 operation of a single trailer, semitrailer, or auxiliary dolly, and the

1 permit shall identify the trailer, semitrailer, or auxiliary dolly
2 authorized by make, model, and vehicle identification number.
3 The permit shall include the name and license number of the
4 manufacturer from whom the new vehicle is sent, or the name and
5 license number of the dealer from whom the used vehicle is sent,
6 the name and address of the person or business receiving the load,
7 a description of the load being carried, and the name and license
8 number of the dealer who will be offering the trailer, semitrailer,
9 or auxiliary dolly for sale. Each permit shall be completed prior
10 to operation of the trailer or semitrailer or auxiliary dolly on a
11 highway. The permit shall be carried on the trailer, semitrailer, or
12 auxiliary dolly to which it applies in an appropriate receptacle
13 inaccessible from the inside of the cab and shall be readily available
14 for inspection by a peace officer. Each permit is valid at the time
15 of inspection by a peace officer only if it has been completed as
16 required by the department and has been placed in the appropriate
17 receptacle as required by this section. The manufacturer or dealer
18 issued the permit may allow a third party to move or operate the
19 vehicle.

20 (c) The privilege of securing and displaying a permit authorized
21 pursuant to this section shall not be extended to a manufacturer,
22 carrier, or dealer located in a jurisdiction with which the state does
23 not have vehicle licensing reciprocity.

24 (d) The privilege of securing and displaying a permit authorized
25 pursuant to this section shall not be granted more than once without
26 the sale and registration of the trailer, semitrailer, or auxiliary
27 dolly.

28 ~~SECTION 1. The Legislature finds and declares all of the~~
29 ~~following:~~

30 ~~(a) California's supply of primary care physicians is below what~~
31 ~~is considered sufficient to meet patient needs. In the rapidly~~
32 ~~growing and ethnically diverse area of inland southern California,~~
33 ~~the shortage is particularly severe, with just 40 primary care~~
34 ~~physicians per 100,000 patients, far fewer than the recommended~~
35 ~~range of 60 to 80 primary care physicians per 100,000 patients.~~
36 ~~Furthermore, Latinos, African Americans, and Native Americans~~
37 ~~are vastly underrepresented in the physician workforce.~~

38 ~~(b) California lags substantially in the number of medical school~~
39 ~~seats per capita, having just 17.3 seats per 100,000 persons,~~
40 ~~compared to the United States average of 31.4 seats per 100,000~~

1 persons, according to statistics published by the Association of
2 American Medical Colleges.

3 (e) According to the California HealthCare Foundation, 72
4 percent of California's 58 counties have an undersupply of primary
5 care physicians, with primary care physicians making up just 34
6 percent of California's physician workforce.

7 (d) The University of California, Riverside, (UCR) has had a
8 longstanding two-year medical education program and its
9 independent four-year school of medicine has received preliminary
10 accreditation from the Liaison Committee on Medical Education,
11 the nationally recognized accrediting body for medical education
12 programs leading to M.D. degrees in the United States and Canada.
13 When this new four-year medical school opens in August 2013,
14 it will become the first new public medical school in California in
15 more than 40 years.

16 (e) This community-based medical school with a public mission
17 to expand and diversify the region's physician workforce and to
18 improve the health of people living in inland southern California
19 has made a commitment to underserved patient populations.

20 (f) There are two principal determinants of where a physician
21 practices: (1) where he or she grew up, and (2) where he or she
22 completes residency training following medical school graduation.

23 (g) The UCR medical school has strategies to capitalize on both
24 of these factors. Among these strategies are all of the following:
25 (1) developing student pipeline programs that inspire more young
26 people in the region to pursue careers in medicine and other allied
27 health professions and to recruit them to the UCR medical school;
28 (2) utilizing a holistic review of medical school applicants that
29 takes into account diverse life experiences in addition to their
30 academic performance; (3) teaching a curriculum that emphasizes
31 key competencies for primary care medicine, including wellness
32 and prevention, evidence-based medicine, and chronic disease
33 management; (4) creating new residency training programs in
34 primary care and those short-supply specialties that are most
35 needed in inland southern California; and (5) continuing UCR's
36 commitment to the recruitment, retention, and advancement of
37 talented students, faculty, and staff from historically excluded
38 populations who are currently underrepresented in medical
39 education and the practice of medicine.

3 ~~innovative “loan-to-scholarship” program, is actively raising~~
4 ~~nonstate funds to expand that program, and is educating students~~

11 ~~(i) The appropriation of state funding in the annual budget, and~~
12 ~~consistent with Section 16 of Assembly Bill 94 of the 2013–14~~

15 ~~help California meet the objectives of the federal Patient Protection~~
