An act to amend Section Sections 22575, 22576, 22577, and 22578 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to privacy.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 242, as amended, Chau. Privacy: Internet.

Existing law requires an operator of a commercial Web site or online service that collects personally identifiable information through the Internet, about individual consumers residing in California who use or visit its commercial Web site or online service, to make its privacy policy available to consumers, as specified.

This bill would require the privacy policy to be no more than 100 words, be written in clear and concise language, be written at no greater than an 8th grade reading level, and to include a statement indicating whether the personally identifiable information may be sold or shared with others, and if so, how and with whom the information may be shared.

This bill would eliminate references to "privacy policy," and instead refer to a privacy policy as a "policy." The bill would require these policies to include hyperlinks to the Web pages where a consumer may file a complaint, as specified, if an operator collects personal information about an individual consumer.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 22575 of the Business and Professions

15 (1) Identify the categories of personally identifiable information that the operator collects through the Web site or online service 16 17 about individual consumers who use or visit its commercial Web 18 site or online service and the categories of third-party persons or 19 entities with whom the operator may share that personally 20 identifiable information. 21 (2) If the operator maintains a process for an individual 22 consumer who uses or visits its commercial Web site or online 23 service to review and request changes to any of his or her 24 personally identifiable information that is collected through the

(b) The privacy policy required by subdivision (a) shall do allof the following:

(1) Identify the categories of personally identifiable information
that the operator collects through the Web site or online service
about individual consumers who use or visit its commercial Web
site or online service and the categories of third-party persons or
entities with whom the operator may share that personally
identifiable information.

(2) If the operator maintains a process for an individual
consumer who uses or visits its commercial Web site or online
service to review and request changes to any of his or her
personally identifiable information that is collected through the
Web site or online service, provide a description of that process.

(3) Describe the process by which the operator notifies
consumers who use or visit its commercial Web site or online
service of material changes to the operator's privacy policy for
that Web site or online service.

28 (4) Identify its effective date.

(5) Disclose how the operator responds to Web browser "do not track" signals or other mechanisms that provide consumers the ability to exercise choice regarding the collection of personally identifiable information about an individual consumer's online activities over time and across third-party Web sites or online services, if the operator engages in that collection.

(6) Disclose whether other parties may collect personally
identifiable information about an individual consumer's online
activities over time and across different Web sites when a consumer
uses the operator's Web site or service.

39 (7) An operator may satisfy the requirement of paragraph (5)40 by providing a clear and conspicuous hyperlink in the operator's

privacy policy to an online location containing a description, 1 2 including the effects, of any program or protocol the operator

3 follows that offers the consumer that choice.

4 (8) If an operator collects personal information about an

5 individual consumer, include hyperlinks to the Web pages where

the consumer may file a complaint with the Attorney General and 6

7 the Federal Trade Commission.

8 SEC. 2. Section 22576 of the Business and Professions Code 9 is amended to read:

10 22576. An operator of a commercial Web site or online service

that collects personally identifiable information through the Web 11 12 site or online service from individual consumers who use or visit

13 the commercial Web site or online service and who reside in

14 California shall be in violation of this section if the operator fails

15 to comply with the provisions of Section 22575 or with the

provisions of its posted-privacy policy in either of the following 16 17 ways:

- 18 (a) Knowingly and willfully.
- 19 (b) Negligently and materially.

20 SEC. 3. Section 22577 of the Business and Professions Code 21 is amended to read:

- 22 22577. For the purposes of this chapter, the following 23 definitions apply:
- (a) The term "personally identifiable information" means 24 25 individually identifiable information about an individual consumer 26 collected online by the operator from that individual and 27 maintained by the operator in an accessible form, including any 28 of the following:
- 29 (1) A first and last name.
- 30 (2) A home or other physical address, including street name and 31 name of a city or town.
- 32
- (3) An e-mail address. 33 (4) A telephone number.
- 34 (5) A social security number.
- 35 (6) Any other identifier that permits the physical or online
- 36 contacting of a specific individual.

37 (7) Information concerning a user that the Web site or online

38 service collects online from the user and maintains in personally

39 identifiable form in combination with an identifier described in

40 this subdivision. 1 (b) The term "conspicuously post" with respect to a privacy 2 policy shall include posting the privacy policy through any of the 3 following:

4 (1) A Web page on which the actual privacy policy is posted if 5 the Web page is the homepage or first significant page after 6 entering the Web site.

7 (2) An icon that hyperlinks to a Web page on which the actual
8 privacy policy is posted, if the icon is located on the homepage or
9 the first significant page after entering the Web site, and if the icon
10 contains the word "privacy." words "using your information."
11 The icon shall also use a color that contrasts with the background

12 color of the Web page or is otherwise distinguishable.

(3) A text link that hyperlinks to a Web page on which the actual
privacy policy is posted, if the text link is located on the homepage
or first significant page after entering the Web site, and if the text
link does one of the following:

17 (A) Includes the word "privacy." words "using your 18 information."

(B) Is written in capital letters equal to or greater in size thanthe surrounding text.

(C) Is written in larger type than the surrounding text, or in
contrasting type, font, or color to the surrounding text of the same
size, or set off from the surrounding text of the same size by
symbols or other marks that call attention to the language.

(4) Any other functional hyperlink that is so displayed that areasonable person would notice it.

(5) In the case of an online service, any other reasonably
accessible means of making the privacy policy available for
consumers of the online service.

30 (c) The term "operator" means any person or entity that owns 31 a Web site located on the Internet or an online service that collects 32 and maintains personally identifiable information from a consumer 33 residing in California who uses or visits the Web site or online 34 service if the Web site or online service is operated for commercial purposes. It does not include any third party that operates, hosts, 35 36 or manages, but does not own, a Web site or online service on the 37 owner's behalf or by processing information on behalf of the 38 owner.

- (d) The term "consumer" means any individual who seeks or 1
- acquires, by purchase or lease, any goods, services, money, or 2 3 credit for personal, family, or household purposes.
- SEC. 4. Section 22578 of the Business and Professions Code 4 5 is amended to read:
- 22578. It is the intent of the Legislature that this chapter is a 6
- matter of statewide concern. This chapter supersedes and preempts 7
- 8 all rules, regulations, codes, ordinances, and other laws adopted
- 9 by a city, county, city and county, municipality, or local agency
- regarding the posting of a privacy policy on an Internet Web site. 10
