ASSEMBLY BILL

No. 386

Introduced by Assembly Member Levine

February 15, 2013

An act to add Article 3.5 (commencing with Section 89225) to Chapter 2 of Part 55 of Division 8 of, and to add Chapter 9.6 (commencing with Section 66760) to Part 40 of Division 5 of, Title 3 of the Education Code, relating to public postsecondary education.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 386, as amended, Levine. Public postsecondary education: cross-enrollment: online education at the California State University.

Existing law establishes the California State University, under the administration of the Trustees of the California State University, the California Community Colleges, under the administration of the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges, and the University of California, under the administration of the Regents of the University of California, as the 3 segments of public postsecondary education in this state. Existing law authorizes any student enrolled in any campus of any of these 3 respective segments who meets prescribed requirements to enroll without formal admission or payment of additional fees, except as provided, in a maximum of one course per academic term at a campus

of either of the other segments on a space-available basis at the discretion of the appropriate campus authorities on both campuses.

This bill would express legislative intent that, by the beginning of the 2015–16 academic year, students enrolled at a California State University (CSU) campus be provided an opportunity to enroll in online courses available at other CSU campuses. The bill would authorize any student enrolled at a campus of the California State University who meets specified requirements to enroll, without formal admission, and without payment of additional tuition or fees, except as provided, in a course provided entirely online, as defined, by another campus of the California State University on a space-available basis. *The bill would require each CSU campus to inform students who may enroll in an online course pursuant to this authority of certain information related to the online course.* The bill would require the trustees, on or before January 1, 2015, to establish an easily accessible online database of online courses available at all CSU campuses to provide CSU students with a streamlined process within the CSU system to allow them to find and enroll in courses that will earn them credit toward graduation, general education, and major requirements.

This bill would require the trustees to establish a series of uniform definitions for online education for CSU on or before January 1, 2015, as specified. The bill would require the trustees to report performance data about online education to the Legislature on or before January 1, 2017, and every 2 years until 2021, *and would, on or before January 1, 2017, require the trustees to report the performance data to the Legislative Analyst. The bill would, on or before October 1, 2017, require the Legislative Analyst to submit to the Legislature a status update regarding CSU's implementation of the provisions of this bill and an assessment of the extent to which CSU's online programs are operating in a manner consistent with legislative intent and statutory requirements.*

This bill would require the trustees to report to the Legislature, on or before January 1, 2015, on the feasibility of developing an accelerated bachelor's degree completion program consisting of online courses aimed at students who started college but never obtained a degree.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. It is the intent of the Legislature:

2 (a) That, by the beginning of the 2015–16 academic year,
3 students enrolled at a California State University (CSU) campus
4 shall be provided the opportunity to enroll in online courses
5 available at other CSU campuses. Students enrolling in online
6 courses at a campus other than their home campus shall be provided
7 a streamlined process of transferring units for credit at the home
8 campus.

9 (b) That the 23 campuses of the California State University
10 system coordinate their online course offerings in order to provide
11 students improved access to coursework and the opportunity to
12 accelerate their degree completion.

13 (c) To foster greater coordination among all segments of higher
14 education in the state, in order to improve student outcomes.

15 (d) That, in addition to intrasystem coordination, the segments
16 of higher education shall take all steps possible to improve
17 coordination within their respective segments.

18 (e) That the segments of higher education appropriately allocate
19 available resources to accomplish the above-stated goals.

20 (f) That the segments of higher education appropriately use
21 existing online education resources to accomplish the above-stated
22 goals.

23 SEC. 2. Chapter 9.6 (commencing with Section 66760) is added
24 to Part 40 of Division 5 of Title 3 of the Education Code, to read:

26 CHAPTER 9.6. CROSS-ENROLLMENT IN ONLINE EDUCATION AT
27 CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY

29 66760. For the purposes of this chapter, the following
30 definitions apply:

31 (a) “Chancellor” means the Chancellor of the California State
32 University.

33 (b) “CSU” means the California State University.

34 (c) “Home campus” means the California State University
35 campus at which the student is matriculated.

36 (d) “Host campus” means the campus to which the student seeks
37 access.

1 66760.5. By the beginning of the 2015–16 academic year, a
2 California resident enrolled at a CSU campus who meets the
3 requirements of *subdivision (a) of Section 66761* may enroll,
4 without formal admission, and without payment of additional
5 tuition or fees, except as provided in Section 66761.5, in a course
6 provided entirely online by another campus of the California State
7 University on a space-available basis. Nonresident and international
8 CSU students who meet these conditions may also enroll in an
9 online course provided by another CSU campus, but shall pay the
10 per unit fees for this course at the host campus.

11 66761. (a) A student is qualified to participate in the program
12 established by this chapter if he or she is enrolled at a CSU campus
13 and meets the following requirements:

14 (a)

15 (1) The student has attained a grade point average of 2.0 on a
16 4-point scale for work completed.

17 (b)

18 (2) The student has paid appropriate tuition or fees, or both,
19 required by the home campus for full-time enrollment for the
20 academic term in which the student seeks to cross-enroll.

21 (c)

22 (3) The student has no outstanding tuition or fees to be paid at
23 the home campus.

24 (b) *Each CSU campus shall inform students who may enroll in*
25 *an online course pursuant to this chapter of all of the following:*

26 (1) *The technical requirements a student must satisfy in order*
27 *to successfully participate in, and complete, the online course.*

28 (2) *Any prerequisite courses or other academic preparation*
29 *deemed necessary for the online course.*

30 (3) *Any materials, skills, knowledge, or other elements necessary*
31 *to ensure a student's opportunity to succeed in the online course.*

32 66761.5. The host campus may charge participating students
33 a reasonable administration fee and specific course-based fees, not
34 to exceed an amount sufficient for the campus to recover reasonable
35 administrative costs it incurs pursuant to this chapter.

36 66762. The chancellor's office shall establish a convenient
37 online methodology so that students meeting the requirements of
38 *subdivision (a) of Section 66761* may do both of the following:

1 (a) Be informed of the opportunity to access courses provided
2 entirely online by another campus of the California State
3 University.

4 (b) Simultaneously enroll in courses at their home campus and
5 enroll in courses provided entirely online at another campus of the
6 California State University, as provided for in Section 66762.5.

7 66762.5. A matriculated CSU student shall have priority access
8 to online courses provided at his or her home campus. A CSU
9 student who meets the requirements of *subdivision (a)* of Section
10 66761, and seeks to enroll in courses provided entirely online by
11 another CSU campus, shall be able to enroll, provided that
12 cross-enrollment students generally have an opportunity to enroll
13 in these online courses at any time after the priority enrollment
14 period for continuing students as determined by each host campus.
15 The host campus enrollment policy shall, to the extent possible,
16 encourage cross-enrollment as provided for in this chapter.

17 66763. A course provided entirely online pursuant to this
18 chapter shall be accepted for credit at the student's home campus
19 on the same basis as it would be for a student matriculated at the
20 host campus.

21 66763.5. The enrollment of a student at a host campus pursuant
22 to this chapter may be counted in the calculation of headcount or
23 full-time equivalent student enrollment at the host campus. The
24 home campus and the host campus at which the student is
25 cross-enrolled may count in the calculation of headcount or
26 full-time equivalent student enrollment only those units for which
27 the student is enrolled at each respective campus.

28 66764. On or before January 1, 2015, the trustees shall establish
29 both of the following:

30 (a) An easily accessible online database of online courses
31 available at all CSU campuses. This database shall provide CSU
32 students with a streamlined process within the CSU system to
33 allow students to find and enroll in courses that will earn them
34 credit toward graduation, general education, and major
35 requirements.

36 (b) Plans for an intrasystem cross-enrollment process to expedite
37 student learning that will be operational at the beginning of the
38 2015–16 academic year.

1 SEC. 3. Article 3.5 (commencing with Section 89225) is added
 2 to Chapter 2 of Part 55 of Division 8 of Title 3 of the Education
 3 Code, to read:

Article 3.5. Online Education

7 89225. On or before January 1, 2015, for the purposes of
 8 measuring the effectiveness of online education, the trustees shall
 9 establish a series of uniform definitions for online education. The
 10 definitions developed by the trustees under this section shall, at a
 11 minimum, include a systemwide definition for an online course
 12 where the course can be entirely completed remotely.

13 89226. (a) On or before January 1, 2017, and on or before
 14 January 1 every two years thereafter, the trustees shall report to
 15 the Legislature key performance data on online courses as defined
 16 in Section 89225, including, but not necessarily limited to, all of
 17 the following:

- 18 (1) The number of students enrolled at each campus.
- 19 (2) Course completion rates for courses other than online
 20 courses.
- 21 (3) Completion rates for degree programs that include no online
 22 courses.
- 23 (4) Grade point average for students enrolled in online courses.
- 24 (5) The number of students cross-enrolled in online courses at
 25 a California State University campus other than the campus at
 26 which they are matriculated.
- 27 (6) Course completion rates for students enrolled in online
 28 courses.
- 29 (7) Completion rates for degree programs that include online
 30 courses.

31 (b) (1) *On or before January 1, 2017, the trustees shall report*
 32 *to the Legislative Analyst the key performance data described in*
 33 *subdivision (a).*

34 (2) *On or before October 1, 2017, the Legislative Analyst shall*
 35 *submit a status update regarding the California State University's*
 36 *implementation of the provisions of the bill that added this section*
 37 *and an assessment of the extent to which the online programs of*
 38 *the California State University are operating in a manner*
 39 *consistent with legislative intent and statutory requirements.*

1 (c) Student enrollment and completion rate data included in a
2 report to be submitted pursuant to this ~~subdivision~~ *section* shall
3 be made available by demographics, including age, gender, and
4 ethnicity.

6 (d) (1) The requirement for submitting a report imposed under
7 subdivision (a) is inoperative on July 1, 2021, pursuant to Section
8 10231.5 of the Government Code.

9 (2) The report prepared pursuant to subdivision (a) shall be
10 submitted in compliance with Section 9795 of the Government
11 Code.

12 SEC. 4. On or before January 1, 2015, the Trustees of the
13 California State University shall report to the Legislature on the
14 feasibility of developing an accelerated bachelor's degree
15 completion program consisting of online courses aimed at students
16 who started college but never obtained a degree. The report
17 prepared pursuant to this section shall be submitted in compliance
18 with Section 9795 of the Government Code.
