An act to amend Section 7506.5 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to repossessionors.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 791, as introduced, Hagman. Collateral recovery: repossessionors.

Existing law, the Collateral Recovery Act, provides for the licensure and regulation of repossession agencies by the Bureau of Security and Investigative Services under the supervision and control of the Director of Consumer Affairs. Existing law requires an applicant for a qualification certificate or for an initial registration or a reregistration to submit an application to the bureau and include certain personal information in the application that is confidential and is prohibited from being disclosed to the public.

This bill would make a technical, nonsubstantive change to these provisions.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 4 confidential pursuant to the Information Practices Act (Chapter 1
- 5 (commencing with Section 1798) of Title 1.8 of Part 4 of Division

- 1 3 of the Civil Code) and shall not be released to the public except
2 for the registrant’s full name, the licensee’s name and address, and
3 the registration number. The application shall be verified and shall
4 include *the following*:
- 5 (a) The full name, residence address, residence telephone
6 number, date and place of birth, and driver’s license number of
7 the applicant or registrant.
 - 8 (b) A statement listing any and all names used by the applicant
9 or registrant, other than the name by which he or she is currently
10 known. If the applicant or registrant has never used a name other
11 than his or her true name, this fact shall be set forth in the
12 statement.
 - 13 (c) The name and address of the licensee and the date the
14 employment or contract commenced.
 - 15 (d) The title of the position occupied by the applicant or
16 registrant and a description of his or her duties.
 - 17 (e) Two recent photographs of the applicant or registrant, of a
18 type prescribed by the chief, and two classifiable sets of his or her
19 fingerprints, one set of which shall be forwarded to the Federal
20 Bureau of Investigation for purposes of a background check.
 - 21 (f) The bureau may impose a fee not to exceed three dollars
22 (\$3) for processing classifiable fingerprint cards submitted by
23 applicants, excluding those submitted into an electronic fingerprint
24 system using electronic fingerprint technology.
