# ASSEMBLY BILL

## No. 939

## **Introduced by Assembly Member Melendez**

February 22, 2013

An act to add Section 49416 to the Education Code, *and to amend Section 1797.196 of the Health and Safety Code*, relating to pupil health.

#### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 939, as amended, Melendez. Pupil and personnel health: automatic external defibrillators.

Existing law authorizes a school district or school to provide a comprehensive program in first aid or cardiopulmonary resuscitation training, or both, to pupils and employees, and requires the program to be developed using specified guidelines.

Existing law requires the principal of a public or private K-12 school with an automatic external defibrillator (AED) to ensure that certain school employees annually receive approved brochures describing the proper use of an AED and that similar information be posted next to every AED, to notify, at least annually, every school employee of the location of all AED units on the campus, and to designate the trained employees who shall be available to respond to an emergency that may involve the use of an AED, as specified.

This bill would state the intent of the Legislature-that to encourage all public schools to acquire and maintain at least one automatic external defibrillator (AED) AED. The bill would authorize a public school to solicit and receive nonstate funds to acquire and maintain an AED. If a public school decides to acquire and maintain an AED, or continue to use and maintain an existing AED, the bill would authorize and

encourage the school to comply with specified requirements. The bill would provide that an employee and the school district are the school district is not liable for civil damages resulting from-specified certain uses or nonuses of an AED, except as provided. The bill would recast the requirements on a public or private K-12 school principal relating to AEDs, as described above, in the Education Code.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 49416 is added to the Education Code,
 to read:

3 49416. (a) It is the intent of the Legislature that to encourage
4 all public schools to acquire and maintain at least one automatic
5 external defibrillator (AED).

6 (b) A public school may solicit and receive nonstate funds to 7 acquire and maintain an AED. These funds shall only be used to 8 acquire and maintain an AED and to provide training to school 9 employees regarding use of an AED. If a public school decides to 10 acquire and maintain an AED, or continue to use and maintain an 11 existing AED, the school may, and is encouraged to, do all of the 12 following:

(1) Place an AED in a centralized location on campus for the
purpose of preventing deaths resulting from sudden cardiac arrests
among pupils, faculty, and visitors.

(2) Have the AED available for use at-a *all* school-sponsored
athletic-event. *events*. The AED placed in a centralized location
on campus may serve as the AED that is available for use at
school-sponsored athletic events that occur at the school campus.
(3) Maintain records of both of the following:

(A) That the AED is maintained and regularly tested according
to the operation and maintenance guidelines set forth by the
manufacturer.

(B) That the AED is checked for readiness after each use andat least once every 30 days if the AED has not been used duringthe preceding 30 days.

(4) Prepare a written medical emergency preparedness plan that
describes the procedures to be followed in the event of a medical
emergency that may involve the use of an AED. The written plan

1 may include, but is not limited to, immediate calling of the 2 emergency 911 telephone number when an AED is used.

3 (5) Require all school employees expected to administer an 4 AED in an emergency to complete a training course in 5 cardiopulmonary resuscitation and AED use that complies with 6 the regulations adopted by the Emergency Medical Services 7 Authority and the standards of the American Heart Association or 8 the American Red Cross. A trained school employee may 9 administer an AED in accordance with the school's medical 10 emergency preparedness plan.

11 (c) (1) An employee of a school district who renders emergency

12 care or treatment pursuant to this section is not liable for civil

13 damages resulting from the use, attempted use, or nonuse of an

14 AED, except as provided in paragraph (3).

(c) (1) If an employee of a school district uses, attempts to use,
or does not use an AED consistent with the requirements of this
section, to render emergency care or treatment, the employee,
school district, or both are school district is not liable for civil
damages resulting from any act or omission in rendering the
emergency care or treatment, including the use or nonuse of an
AED, except as provided in paragraph-(3). (2).

(2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply in the case of personal injury
or wrongful death that results from gross negligence or willful or
wanton misconduct on the part of the person who uses, attempts
to use, or maliciously fails to use an AED to render emergency
care or treatment.

29 (d) For purposes of this section, a "school-sponsored athletic 30 event" means a school-sponsored extracurricular athletic activity,

31 which includes practice for and competition in an interscholastic

32 athletic sporting event held at any location, including a nonpublic33 school facility.

(e) When an AED is placed in a public or private K-12 school,
the principal shall do all of the following:

10 1797.196. (a) For purposes of this section, "AED" or 11 "defibrillator" means an automated or automatic external 12 defibrillator.

(b) In order to ensure public safety, any person or entity that
acquires an AED is not liable for any civil damages resulting from
any acts or omissions in the rendering of the emergency care under
subdivision (b) of Section 1714.21 of the Civil Code, if that person
or entity does all of the following:

18 (1) Complies with all regulations governing the placement of 19 an AED.

20 (2) Ensures all of the following:

21 (A) That the AED is maintained and regularly tested according 22 to the operation and maintenance guidelines set forth by the 23 manufacturer, the American Heart Association, and the American 24 Red Cross, and according to any applicable rules and regulations 25 set forth by the governmental authority under the federal Food and 26 Drug Administration and any other applicable state and federal 27 authority. 28 (B) That the AED is checked for readiness after each use and

28 (B) That the AED is checked for reachess after each use and 29 at least once every 30 days if the AED has not been used in the 30 preceding 30 days. Records of these checks shall be maintained.

(C) That any person who renders emergency care or treatment
on a person in cardiac arrest by using an AED activates the
emergency medical services system as soon as possible, and reports
any use of the AED to the licensed physician and to the local EMS
agency.

(D) For every AED unit acquired up to five units, no less than
one employee per AED unit shall complete a training course in
cardiopulmonary resuscitation and AED use that complies with
the regulations adopted by the Emergency Medical Service
Authority and the standards of the American Heart Association or

1 the American Red Cross. After the first five AED units are 2 acquired, for each additional five AED units acquired, one 3 employee shall be trained beginning with the first AED unit 4 acquired. Acquirers of AED units shall have trained employees 5 who should be available to respond to an emergency that may 6 involve the use of an AED unit during normal operating hours.

7 (E) That there is a written plan that describes the procedures to 8 be followed in the event of an emergency that may involve the use 9 of an AED, to ensure compliance with the requirements of this 10 section. The written plan shall include, but not be limited to, 11 immediate notification of 911 and trained office personnel at the 12 start of AED procedures.

13 (3) When an AED is placed in a building, building owners shall 14 ensure that tenants annually receive a brochure, approved as to 15 content and style by the American Heart Association or American 16 Red Cross, which describes the proper use of an AED, and also 17 ensure that similar information is posted next to any installed AED. 18 (4) When an AED is placed in a building, no less than once a 19 year, building owners shall notify their tenants as to the location 20 of AED units in the building. 21 (5) When an AED is placed in a public or private K-12 school,

22 the principal shall ensure that the school administrators and staff 23 annually receive a brochure, approved as to content and style by 24 the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross, that 25 describes the proper use of an AED. The principal shall also ensure 26 that similar information is posted next to every AED. The principal 27 shall, at least annually, notify school employees as to the location 28 of all AED units on the campus. The principal shall designate the 29 trained employees who shall be available to respond to an 30 emergency that may involve the use of an AED during normal 31 operating hours. As used in this paragraph, "normal operating 32 hours" means during the hours of classroom instruction and any 33 school-sponsored activity occurring on school grounds.

34 (c) Any person or entity that supplies an AED shall do all of 35 the following:

36 (1) Notify an agent of the local EMS agency of the existence,37 location, and type of AED acquired.

38 (2) Provide to the acquirer of the AED all information governing

39 the use, installation, operation, training, and maintenance of the 40 AED.

1 (d) A violation of this provision is not subject to penalties 2 pursuant to Section 1798.206.

3 (e) The protections specified in this section do not apply in the 4 case of personal injury or wrongful death that results from the 5 gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct of the person

6 who renders emergency care or treatment by the use of an AED.

7 (f) Nothing in this section or Section 1714.21 of the Civil Code

8 may shall be construed to require a building owner or a building

9 manager to acquire and have installed an AED in any building.
