An act to amend Section 33126.15 of the Education Code, relating to school accountability.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1083, as introduced, Brown. School accountability report card: standardized template.

Existing law requires the State Department of Education to develop and recommend for adoption by the State Board of Education a standardized template intended to simplify the process for completing the school accountability report card and to make the school accountability report card more meaningful to the public. Existing law requires the department, by July 1, 2006, to develop, and recommend for adoption by the state board, a revision to the standardized template.

This bill would make a nonsubstantive change to that latter provision.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

3 33126.15. (a) By July 1, 2006, the department shall develop,

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1 (b) The revision to the standardized template recommended by 2 the department shall include a comparison of the actual unrestricted 3 funding per pupil allocated for the specific benefit of the school 4 or for the benefit of all schools in the district equally, compared to the districtwide average and to the state average of the same 5 computation. The comparison shall include the percentage by 6 7 which the school is above or below the districtwide average and 8 the state average. 9 (c) The revision to the standardized template recommended by the department shall include a field for reporting the actual 10

11 restricted funding, per pupil, allocated for the specific benefit of 12 the school or for the benefit of all schools in the district equally.

(d) The revision to the standardized template recommended by
the department shall include a comparison of the average of actual

15 salaries paid to certificated instructional personnel, compared to

16 the districtwide average and to the state average of the same

17 computation. This comparison shall include the percentage by

18 which the school is above or below the districtwide average and

19 the state average.

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
