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An act to amend Section 69999.16 of the Education Code, relating to postsecondary education.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1781, as amended, Linder. California National Guard Education Assistance Award Program.

Existing law establishes the California National Guard Education Assistance Award Program, which provides financial aid to qualifying members of the California National Guard, the State Military Reserve, and the Naval Militia, under the administration of the Student Aid Commission. ~~Under existing law, a qualified member, as defined, of the California National Guard and State Military Reserve Commission, in consultation with the Military Department. Existing law provides that a qualifying member is eligible to receive financial assistance under the program~~ an award if, among other conditions, the person enrolls in at least 3 academic units per semester, or the equivalent thereof.

This bill would revise this eligibility condition to specify that it is satisfied by a person enrolling in at least 3 academic units ~~for a~~ per summer session or intersession term. *The bill also would state various legislative findings, declarations, and intent relating to these provisions.*

*The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

1     SECTION 1. *The Legislature finds and declares both of the*  
2 *following:*

3     (a) *The California National Guard Education Award Assistance*  
4 *Program is a highly effective student-soldier assistance program*  
5 *emphasizing certification, program, and degree completion.*

6     (b) *Student-soldiers are strongly encouraged to seek available*  
7 *academic advising services to create their academic schedule and*  
8 *program with the goal of working towards a certification or degree.*

9     SEC. 2. *It is the intent of the Legislature to build upon the*  
10 *success of the California National Guard Education Award*  
11 *Assistance Program by providing student-soldiers more flexibility*  
12 *in achieving their academic goals.*

13     SECTION 1.

14     SEC. 3. Section 69999.16 of the Education Code is amended  
15 to read:

16     69999.16. (a) Commencing January 1 of the 2009–10 academic  
17 year, and each academic year thereafter, any qualifying member  
18 of the California National Guard, the State Military Reserve, or  
19 the Naval Militia may apply for a California National Guard  
20 Education Assistance Award.

21     (b) A qualifying member shall meet all of the following  
22 conditions to be eligible to receive a California National Guard  
23 Education Assistance Award:

24     (1) The person is a resident within the meaning of Section  
25 68017.

26     (2) The person is an active member of, and has served two years  
27 in, the California National Guard, the State Military Reserve, or  
28 the Naval Militia.

29     (3) The person has been accepted or registered at, or enrolled  
30 in, a qualifying institution, as defined in subdivision (l) of Section  
31 69432.7.

32     (4) The person agrees to use the award to obtain a certificate,  
33 degree, or diploma that he or she does not hold at the time he or  
34 she applies for the award, and enrolls in at least three academic  
35 units per semester, or the equivalent thereof, ~~including or per~~  
36 ~~summer session and or intersession terms.~~ *term.*

1 (5) The person has submitted the Free Application for Federal  
2 Student Aid (FAFSA) to the United States Department of  
3 Education.

4 (c) Each person applying for a California National Guard  
5 Education Assistance Award shall submit an application for an  
6 award to the Adjutant General.

7 (d) The Adjutant General shall do all of the following:

8 (1) Annually identify the skills most needed by the California  
9 National Guard to retain members who possess, or seek to possess,  
10 those identified skills.

11 (2) Prioritize those applicants who qualify for an award pursuant  
12 to subdivision (b) based on the skills most needed by the California  
13 National Guard, as identified pursuant to paragraph (1).

14 (3) Select award recipients from among eligible applicants  
15 pursuant to subdivision (e).

16 (4) Certify the eligibility of applicants to the Student Aid  
17 Commission.

18 (5) Notify recipients of their selection for an award.

19 (e) The Adjutant General shall select recipients who have been  
20 judged by the Adjutant General to have outstanding ability on the  
21 basis of criteria that may include, but shall not be limited to, any  
22 of the following:

23 (1) The Military Occupational Specialty Code or the Air Force  
24 Specialty Code.

25 (2) An annual noncommissioned officer evaluation report or  
26 officer evaluation report of the preceding two years.

27 (3) A memorandum from the applicant's commander  
28 recommending the applicant for the award.

29 (4) Commendations the applicant has received.

30 (5) An essay, written by the applicant, explaining why education  
31 is important to the applicant.

32 (f) The number of awards issued by the Student Aid Commission  
33 in any fiscal year shall be limited to the number authorized in the  
34 annual Budget Act for that year, but in no event shall exceed 1,000  
35 in any fiscal year.

36 (g) The Student Aid Commission shall issue the awards in  
37 accordance with Section 69999.18.

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
