An act to amend Section 30000 of the Penal Code, relating to firearms.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2300, as introduced, Ridley-Thomas. Firearms: Prohibited Armed Persons File.

Existing law requires the Attorney General to establish and maintain an online database, the Prohibited Armed Persons File, to cross-reference persons who have ownership or possession of a firearm on or after January 1, 1991, and who, subsequent to the date of that ownership or possession, fall within a class of persons who are prohibited from owning or possessing a firearm.

This bill would instead require that the Prohibited Armed Persons File include persons who have ownership or possession of a firearm on or after January 1, 1996.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 30000 of the Penal Code is amended to

3 30000. (a) The Attorney General shall establish and maintain
4 an online database to be known as the Prohibited Armed Persons
5 File. The purpose of the file is to cross-reference persons who have

1 ownership or possession of a firearm on or after January 1, ~~1991~~,
2 1996, as indicated by a record in the Consolidated Firearms
3 Information System, and who, subsequent to the date of that
4 ownership or possession of a firearm, fall within a class of persons
5 who are prohibited from owning or possessing a firearm.
6 (b) The information contained in the Prohibited Armed Persons
7 File shall only be available to those entities specified in, and
8 pursuant to, subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11105, through the
9 California Law Enforcement Telecommunications System, for the
10 purpose of determining if persons are armed and prohibited from
11 possessing firearms.
